Proposed change:

To pilot the introduction of criteria for referral to assessment for adult autism and ADHD assessments, and a new approach to screening for neurodiversity through an online screening tool called the Do-It Profiler in York Place and North Yorkshire Place. The changes are in the context of growing demand for adult autism and ADHD assessments resulting in unacceptable wait times and the need to prioritise resources towards most at-risk adults. The pilot is intended to test the new referral process and the Do-IT Profiler approach over a number of months, to enable further review and engagement to develop a more sustainable approach from July 2024.

Following the decision that was taken at PODG (NY) and SLT (York) in June to extend the pilot for a further 9 months, it was agreed to do some further work to review the decision to ensure that all of the options were appropriately considered. See embedded report in Documents tab.

In response to feedback from The Retreat and the wider neurodiverse community around the definition and pathway for 'red' referrals, the ICB has worked with The Retreat and TEWV to determine a revised referral pathway that sets out a 'priority' referral process and set of 'priority' criteria with referral direct from the GP or CMHT, along with a routine referral pathway via the online platform. The former acceptance criteria will be removed from the online platform.



Summary of findings:

The pilot pathway is designed to connect people with support more quickly and help prioritise resources towards most at-risk adults. Previously, all referrals were assessed in chronological date order and there was no system for identifying those people who needed help more urgently. The purpose of the 'priority' process is to give the GP a route to request a clinical review by The Retreat against a set of criteria. If the request to prioritise is accepted, the referral will move up The Retreat's current waiting list and the patient will be seen for assessment sooner.

Priority referrals are via direct referral from a GP or health practitioner in primary care, and/or mental health practitioner in secondary care through a referral form with an accompanying pro-forma where it would be triaged against the priority criteria.

People who do not meet the priority criteria will be directed to the online platform to complete the neurodiverse modules. They will be

People who do not meet the priority criteria will be directed to the online platform to complete the neurodiverse modules. They will be offered the opportunty to remain on the waiting list for future triage, in chronological date order, as and when capacity becomes available, and/or offered/signposted to appropriate relevant support All patients who complete the profile will receive immediate functional guidance and signposting to support networks.

Data from the online platform shows the number of people experiencing mental health issues such as eating disorders and data from the sensory profile can be used to map support activity such as executive functioning, independent living skills, time management/organisation dealing with anxiety and low mood and understanding local pathways to services. The aim is to develop programmes/workshops for people needing such support

The pilot aims to identify those most at risk and channel them towards a face-to-face intervention with the specialist provider while allowing others, who might have had to wait years for a diagnosis, to access help online at a much earlier stage. This increases the overall number of patients benefitting from an intervention, and ensures those most in need obtain a more appropriate face-to-face referral. The introduction of criteria means that people who meet the expedited criteria can be referred directly by their GP or mental health professional and be considered by The Retreat to be moved up the waiting list. The service will be provided to people irrespective of, but with respect for all equality characteristics. A programme of engagement is planned and where possible, the service will obtain full equality information and determine the likely impacts. Due regard will be taken of this information during the pilot phase. A review of the impact will also be undertaken post implementation, considering any impact on equality groups

The specialist provider has indicated that there is a significant risk to staff retention with the current level of demand and the significant waiting lists. The revised pathway should alleviate some of that pressure and allow staff to concentrate on assessment, diagnosis and post diagnostic support for those most clinically vulnerable

The National Autism Framework states the ambition to improve long waits and quality of information. It also recognises workforce pressures. The pilot aims to address the long waits by enabling people to have access to immediate support and enables those most at risk to be seen quicker. It collates quality information to inform triage, onward assessment and/or support, and it uses a challenged resource and workforce in a more efficient and effective way, enabling the focus to be on more at risk or complex patients whilst ensuring everyone gets more timely support.

Sustainability Guidance

Sustainability = how to meet the needs of the current generation without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their needs. Sustainability

This area includes waste and pollution, recycling, use of resources, ethical purchasing, biodiversity, provision of green spaces. Will this course of action increase the amount of non-recyclable waste? Increase air pollution?

Current issues for the NHS include recycling of unused pharmaceuticals, safe disposal of medical waste, use of anaesthetic gases, purchasing of surgical gloves, and engaging in ethical purchasing that does not harm biodiversity (eg no palm oil) or exploit workers in other countries.

CO2 Reduction

Does this course of action increase or decrease the use of fossil fuels (gas, oil, coal, petrol)? Does it increase or reduce the amount of travel? Will buildings become more efficient, better insulated, use less heating/ air conditioning?

Climate Change Adaptation

Does this take into account climate change risks for the area (increased flooding, higher summer temperatures)?

Rural Proofing

Almost a third of the CCG's population live in rural areas – how will this course of action affect their ability to access services? Increases in age and disability lead to a reduced ability to drive and greater dependence on public transport.


