Ward budget update

Starting point for 2017/18

Ward budget	£15,883
Highways budget	£4,895

Notes:

- We had already allocated £11,733 from the 2017/18 ward budget to help fund the playground improvements for Nelsons Lane and Woodthorpe Green, in addition to £8,762 allocated from the 2016/17 ward budget
- 2. £1,774.06 has been deducted to go towards 2017/18 grounds maintenance costs

2017/18 Ward Budget

• Groups were invited to apply for funding for schemes which address our ward priorities:

- ✓ improving the local environment
- ✓increasing community involvement
- ✓improving access to services and support
- ✓ promoting community safety
- Application window closed on 30 April, Ward Team met on 9 May to review and discuss applications
- Ward councillors then met to agree sums to be allocated
