## **Comments/Observations:**

**Mansion House –** Officer outlined the concerns and particular cases of delivery vehicles being left in place for quite some time before and during civic events at the Mansion House and this poorly represents the city to visiting dignitaries. The proposals is for the loading ban to be a 24 hour restriction across the Mansion House frontage. This arrangement does not interfere with the current footstreets experimental order regarding less of the outcome of that experiment.

<u>Decision</u>: Agreed to approve the advertising of the proposed 24 hour loading ban restriction outside the Mansion House.

**St Helen's Square –** Officer explained there have been report of an apparent increase in the number of cars parking in St. Helen's Square following the introduction of the bollards at the end of Davygate during the footstreet hours. Although the alleged increase is purely anecdotal there is clearly potential for this to become a growing problem.

<u>Decision:</u> Agreed to take no action at this time and monitor the situation during the outcome of the footstreet experiment.

**Whip-Ma-Whop-Ma-Gate** – Officer outlined comments had been received from delivery company in response to the new footstreet hours that there are occasions when the area marked out as "loading only" in Whip-Ma-Whop-Ma-Gate is parked in by car drivers. The intention has always been for this area to be for use exclusively by deliveries, though it has never been formalised in a Traffic Regulation Order.

<u>Decision:</u> Agreed to approve the advertising of a 7am to 7pm loading only bay in Whip-Ma-Whop-Ma-Gate.
