Development of a Specialist Activity Base for adults with a learning disability and/or autism alongside a Community Hub at Burton Stone Community Centre.

2. What are the main objectives or aims of the service/policy/function/criteria?

The model

The main objective is to create a vibrant community asset by enhancing the facility and ensuring current community use is developed alongside the activities which focus on delivering services for adults with a learning disability and/or autism. There is a clear strategy to achieve integrated opportunities and community connections.

The Service

Burton Stone Community Centre will be a fully integrated community hub, with the Specialist Activity Base enhancing the Centre.

Health and Wellbeing wish to develop and enhance the current offer at Burton Stone Community Centre for adults with a learning disability and/or autism. This will benefit those who already access Burton Stone Community Centre as part of their day activity experiences, as well extending the opportunity for other adults with a learning disability and/or autism to access activities taking place at the Centre.

As well as being a place for adults with a learning disability and/or autism, we envisage the Specialist Activity Base to be a local resource for the community providing support, education and training as well as promoting inclusiveness and encouraging social responsibility. It will also include a 'safe place' for those with complex Autism. The space will incorporate a sensory room, changing place and storage area in order to facilitate more bespoke activities as well as individuals integrating with other education and leisure activities more widely as part of their daily lives.

In York, one of our five priorities is 'Building Strong Communities' with the emphasis on helping communities to become more independent and involving them more in making decisions about the services they need. To help facilitate this, the Council wants to create an infrastructure that will encourage every community to come together through a network of hubs of which Burton Stone Community Centre will be one.
