11. Exclusion of Press and Public (10:01am)

Resolved: To exclude the press and public from the meeting for item 7 of the Agenda under Section 100(A) of the Local Government Act 1972 on the grounds that it was likely to involve the disclosure of exempt information as defined in paragraphs 1 and 2 (Information relating to any individual and Information likely to reveal the identity of an individual) of Part 1 of Schedule 12A of

12. Determination of an Application for a drivers' licences for hackney carriages and private hire vehicles (Section 51)
