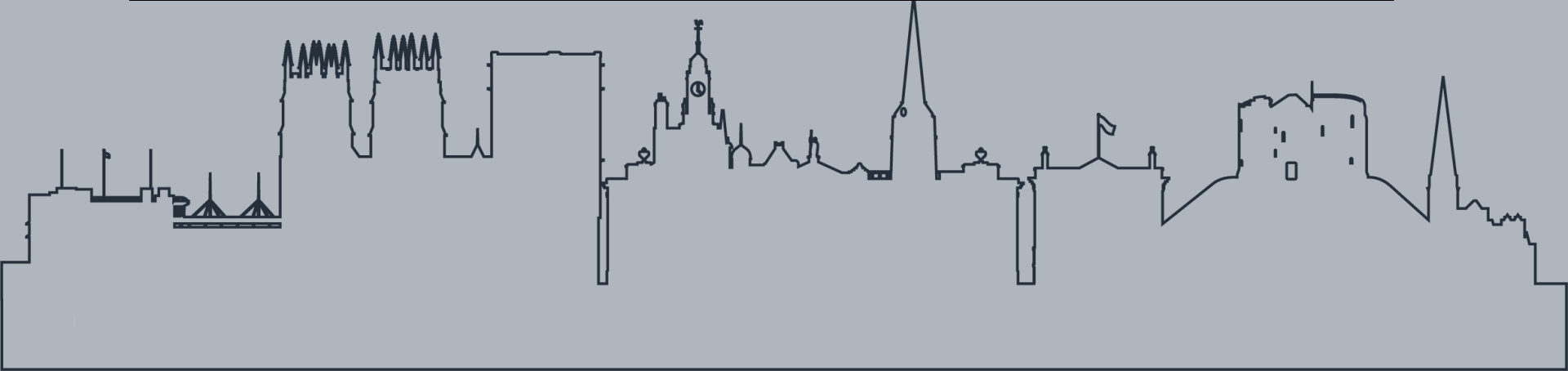
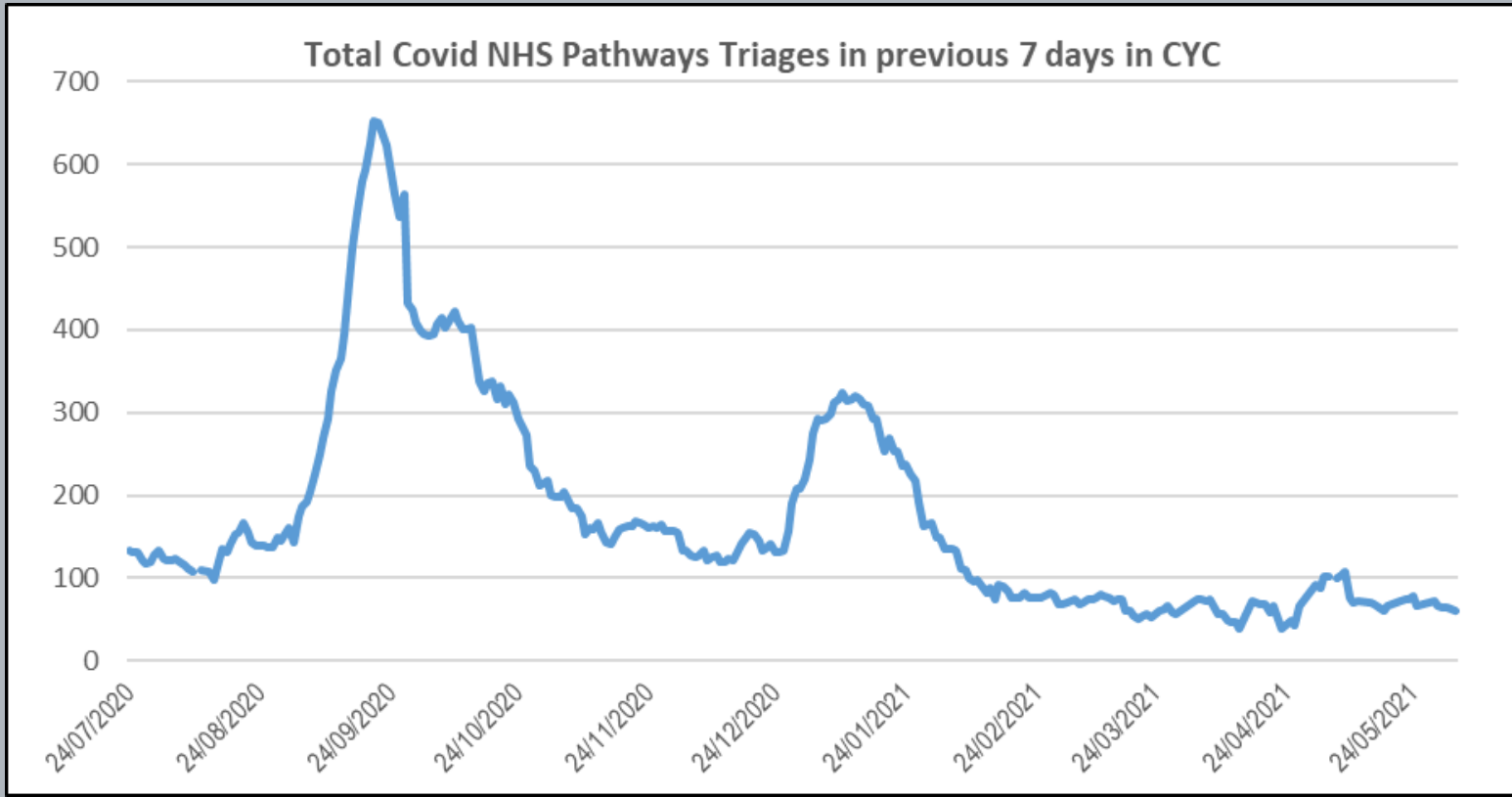
- Epidemic Curve



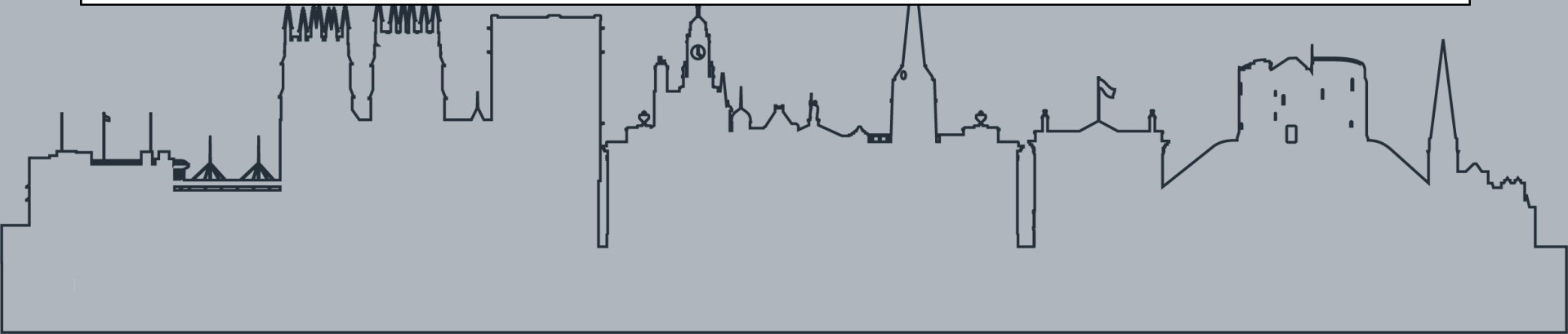
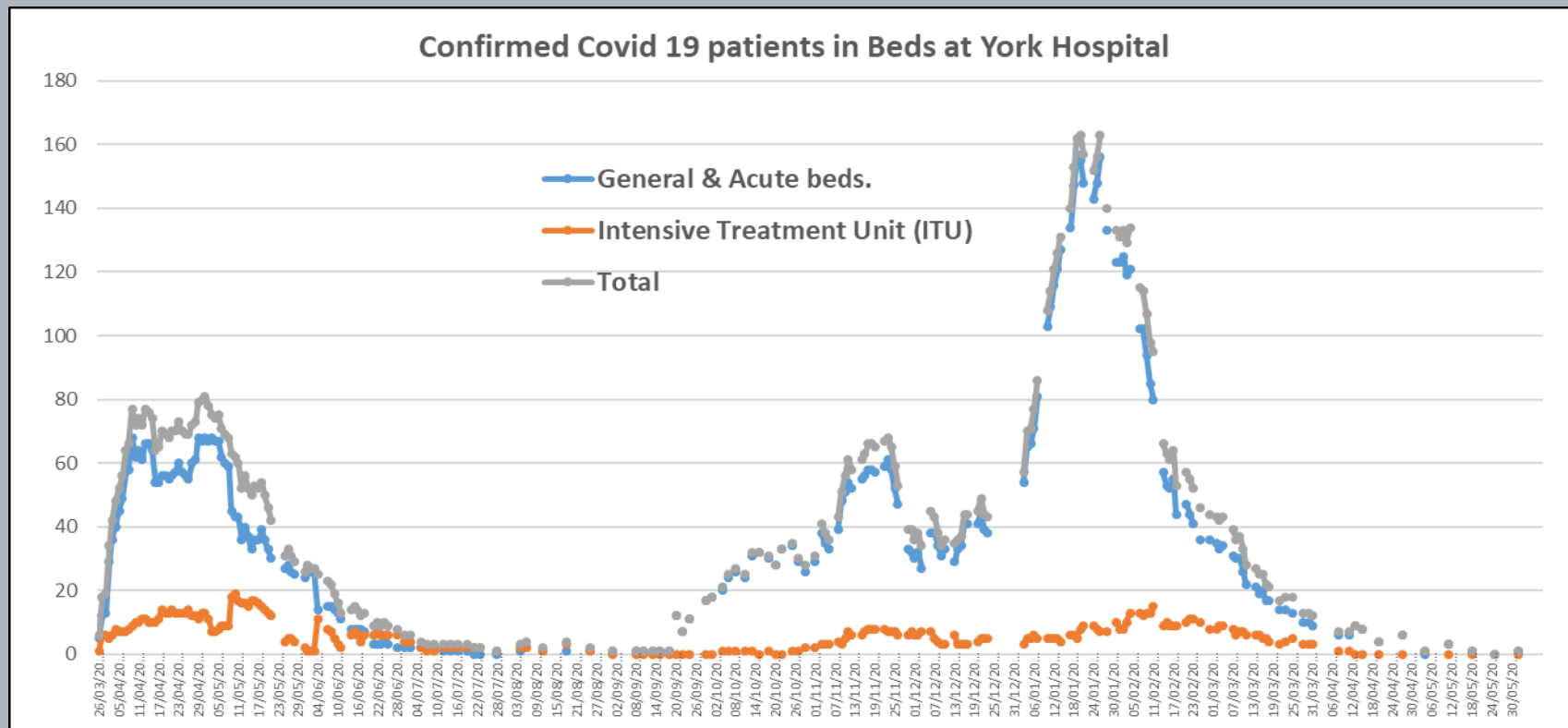
The latest official “validated” rate of new Covid cases per 100,000 of population for the period 28.5.21 to 3.6.21 in York was **28.5** (60 cases). The national and regional averages at this date were 44.2 and 46.9 respectively

The rate of new Covid cases per 100,000 of population for the period 1.6.21 to 8.6.21 for people aged 60+ in York was 6.1 (3 cases). The national and regional averages were 8.6 and 10.1 respectively.

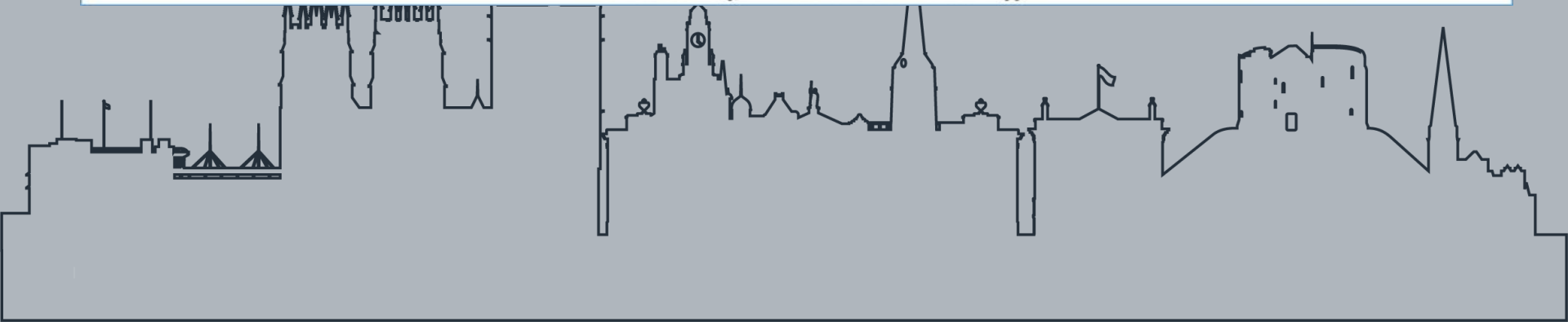
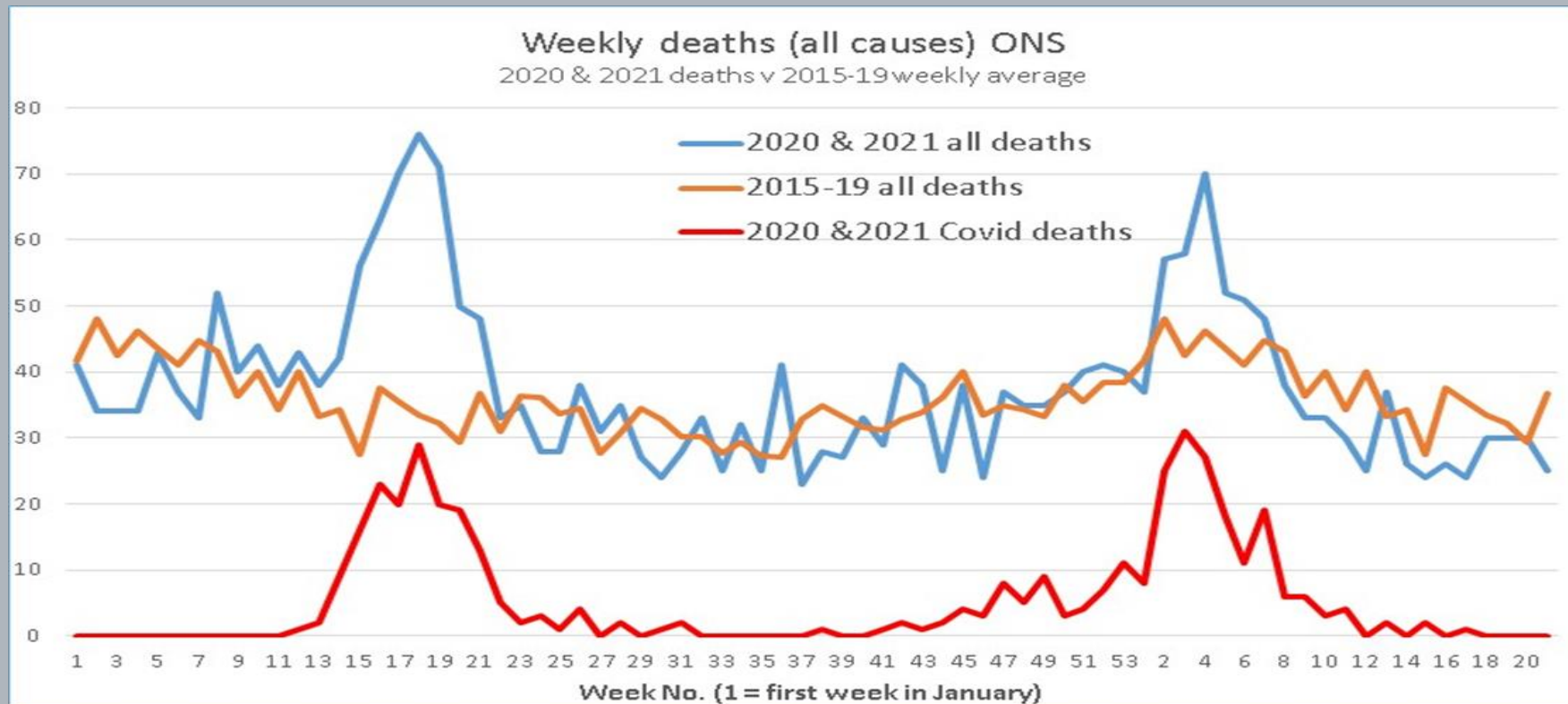




As at 1.6.21 there was 1 person with Covid in General and Acute beds and 0 in ITU.



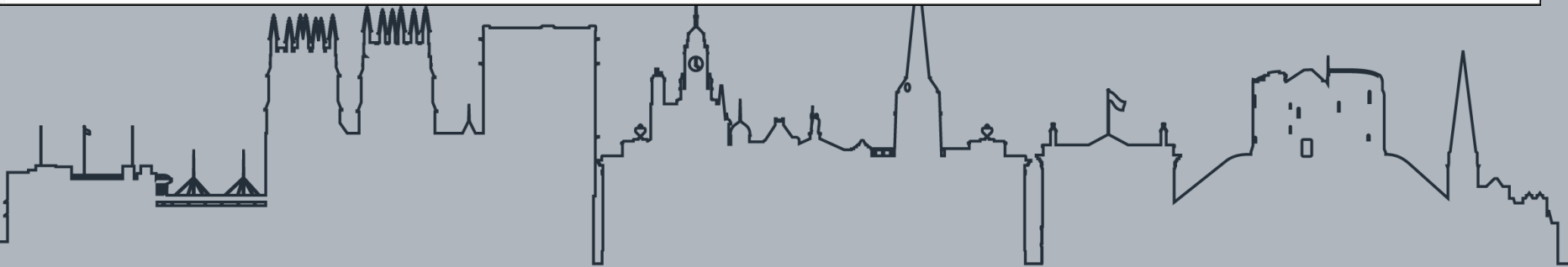
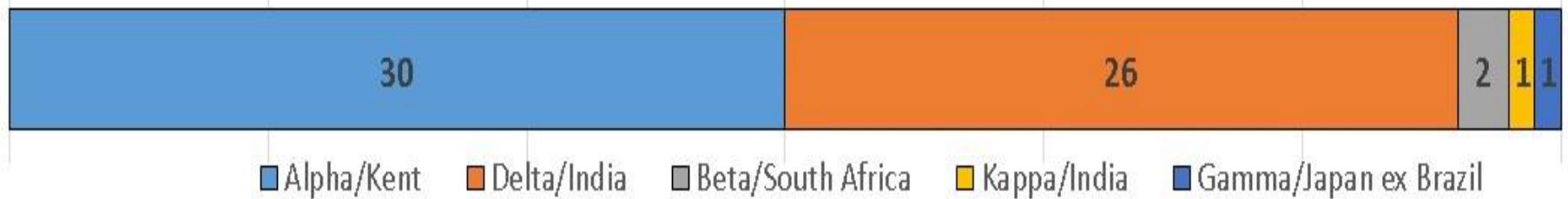
In the most recent period (Week 21: 22.5.21 to 28.5.21) **0** Covid-19 deaths were recorded as having occurred for CYC residents. The last death CYC was in week 17. There have been **140** 'excess deaths' in York since the start of the 2020 (using the 2015-2019 weekly average number of deaths as the comparator)



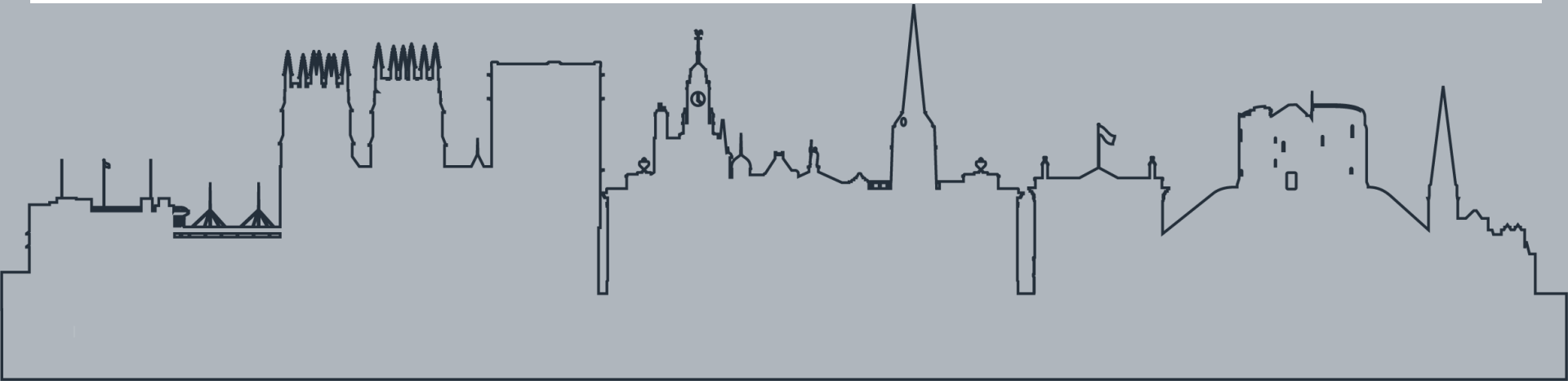
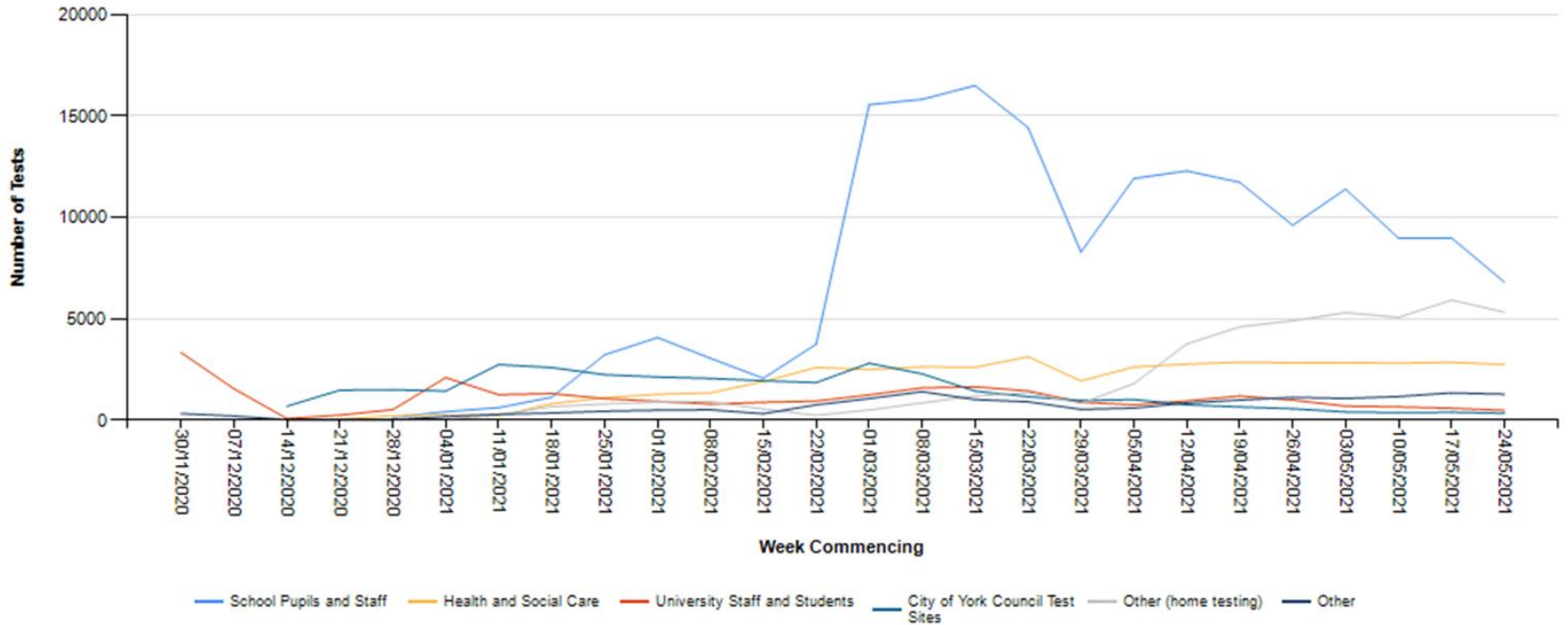

In the latest month for which data is available, **60** cases in York (with a specimen date between 6th May 2021 and 5th June 2021) had been processed in a laboratory which is able to carry out the required sequencing in order to identify Variants of Concern (VOC) or Variants under Investigation (VUI). The breakdown is as follows: VOC B.1.1.7 (Alpha/Kent): **30** confirmed ; VOC B.1.617.2 (Delta /India): **26** provisional; VOC B.1.351 (Beta/South Africa): **2** confirmed ; VUI B.1.617.1 (Kappa/India): **1** confirmed and VOC PI (Gamma – Japan ex Brazil): **1** Provisional.

Local work to increase testing awareness and uptake



- Since 19th May door knocking in areas with higher 20-40 population and lower vaccine uptake:
 - 1,519 properties 1,221 boxes of kits distributed
- Presence at Foss Island Retail Park
 - 90 boxes of kits in 1 day
- Since 19th May providing testing kits at mass vaccination site
 - 1,054 boxes of kits distributed over 8 days

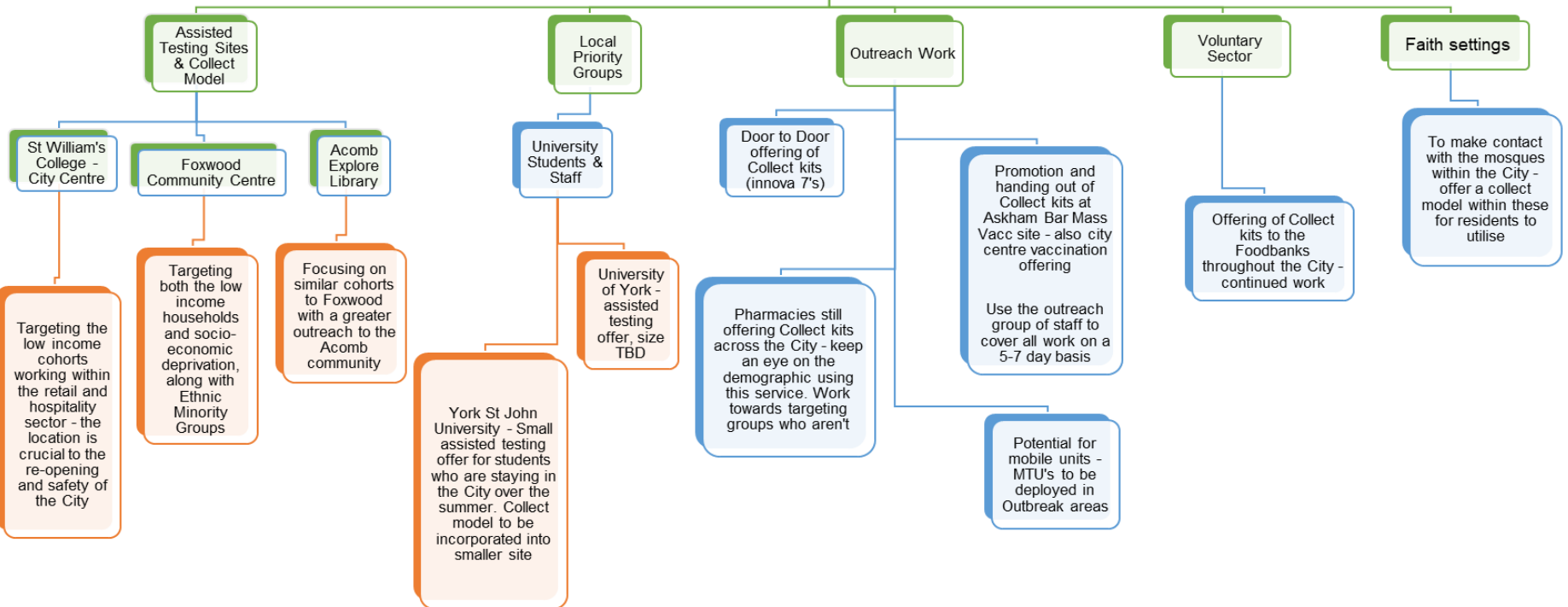
Disproportionately Impacted Groups

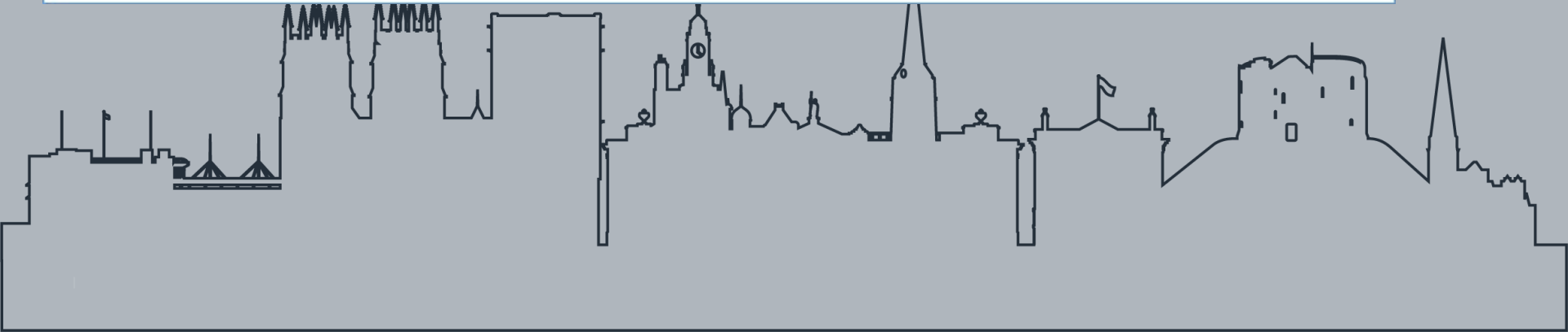
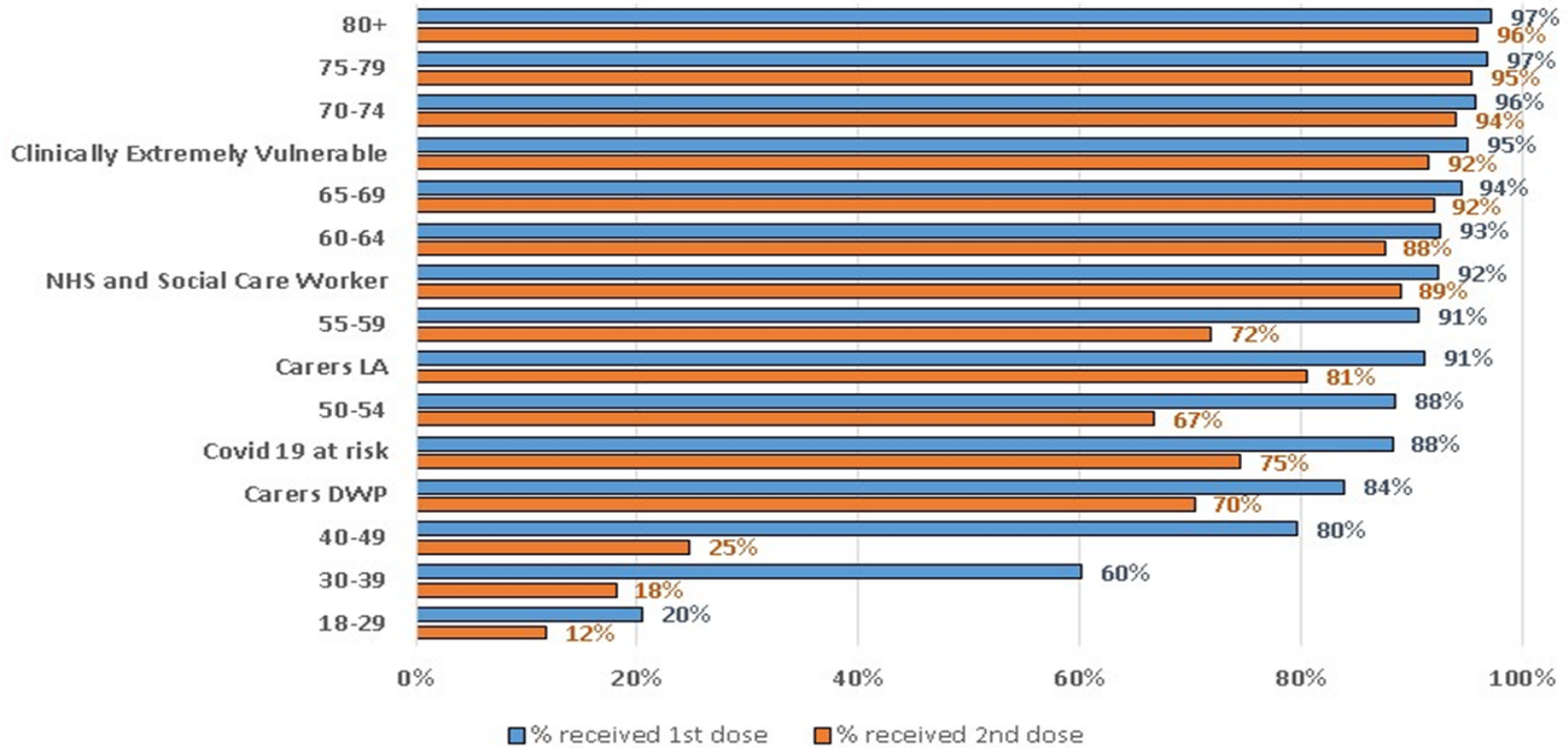


As at 7.6.21 a total of **123,695** CYC residents have had the first dose of the vaccine. This represents **58.7%** of the estimated total population of York and **71.1%** of the estimated adult (18+) population of York.

As at 7.6.21 a total of **83,966** CYC residents have had both doses of the vaccine. This represents **39.9%** of the estimated total population of York and **48.3%** of the estimated adult (18+) population of York.



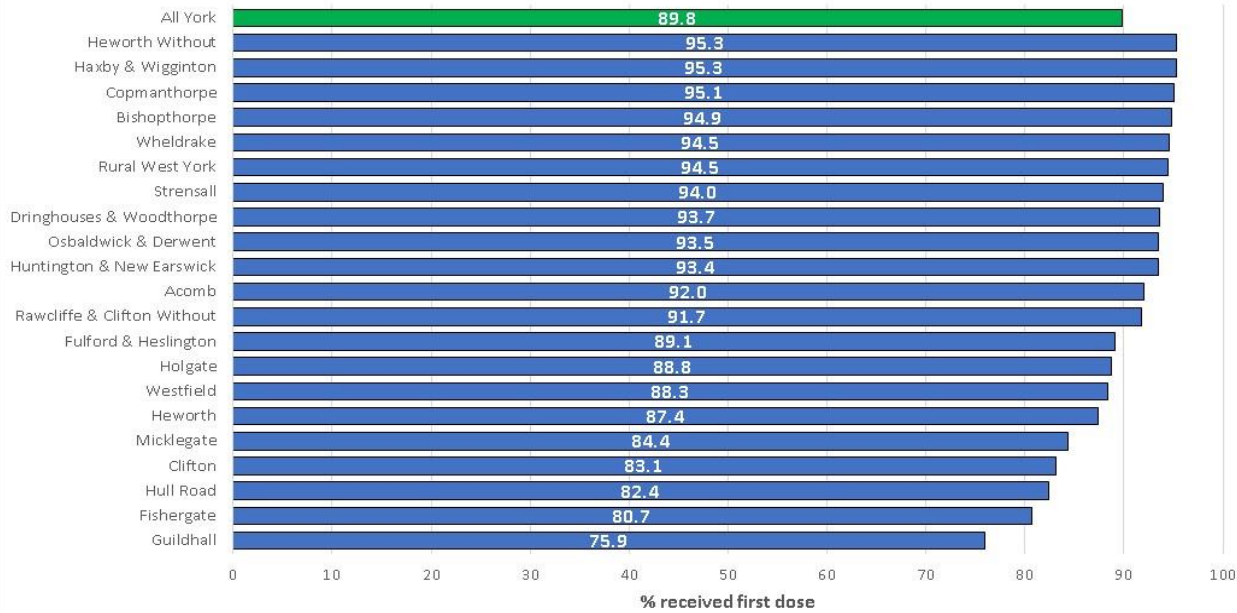
% Receiving the Vaccine by Age / Category - CYC Residents



% 40+ ward population received 1st Dose v York Average

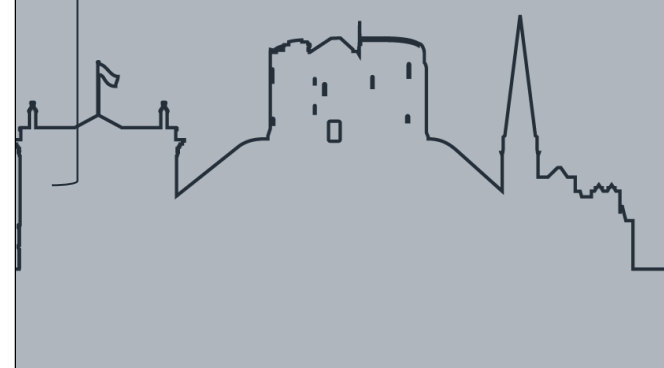
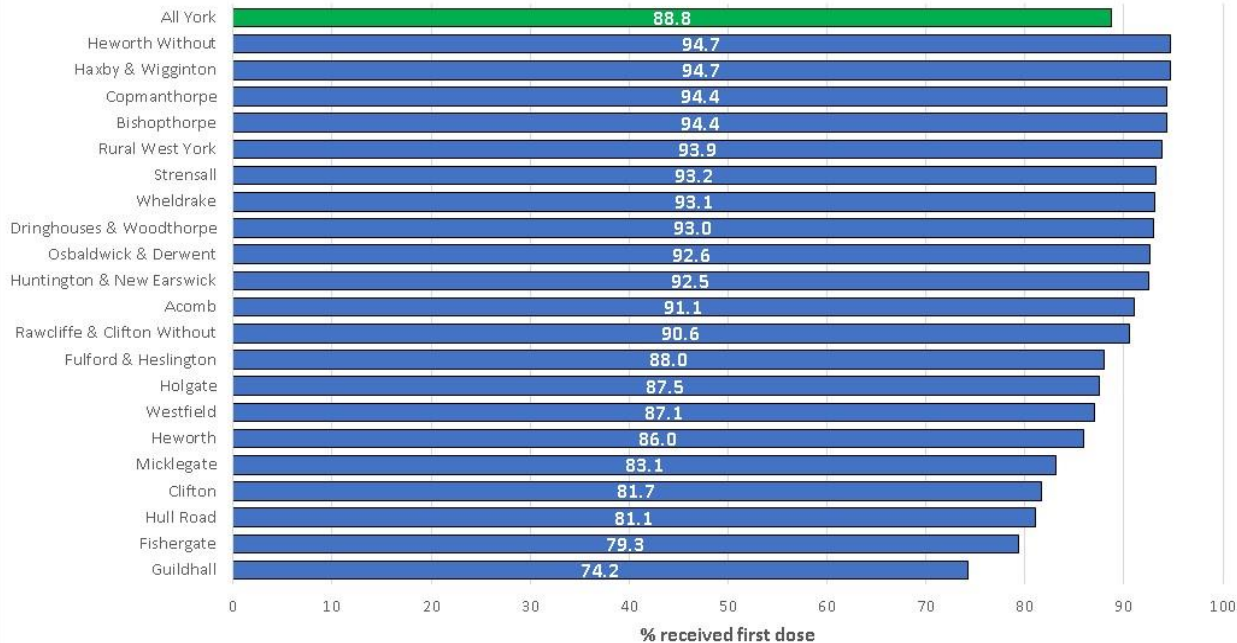
