

- The outcome of ward grant applications is communicated to the applicant via the Community Officer, who supports the applicant through the application process. Their details can be found on posters throughout the ward, in noticeboards, in the Our City magazine or ward newsletters, and on the website or by ringing the main council switchboard number/email.
- There is a web-form which is available online on the Council website and this is accessible and includes advice, guidance and a proposal template.
- Ward Funding proposals or ideas can be discussed at Ward Team meetings, with the Community Officer, Councillors, or with council teams.
- The Community Officer also updates the website with ward funding timelines for applications, amount of budget, and emails the network of community partners, known as the Ward Team, with information as well as invitations and reminders to apply.
