



Position in Region




Epidemic Curve




The latest official “validated” rate of new Covid cases per 100,000 of population for the period 17.9.21 to 23.9.21 in York was **226.5** (478 cases). The national and regional averages at this date were **324.7** and **411.7** respectively (using data published on Gov.uk on 28.9.21).

Cases in the last 7 days per 100,000 by 5 year age band in York




The rate of new Covid cases per 100,000 of population for the period 17.9.21 to 23.9.21 for people aged **60+** in York was **98.2** (49 cases). The national and regional averages were **118.2** and **160.9** respectively.

7 Day Rate of new cases per 100,000 (60+ only)




As at 26.9.21 there had been **50** total covid telephony triages in the CYC area in the last 7 days. The peak number of triages was **192** in the 7 day period to 22.9.20.

No. of Covid NHS Pathways telephony triages in previous 7 days for CYC residents (since 9.7.20)





As at 24.9.21 there were **37** people with Covid in a General / Acute bed and **3** in ITU.

Confirmed Covid 19 patients in Beds at York Hospital








In the first 3 weeks of term, 11% of all cases are in primary school children, and 20% of all cases in secondary school children.




Where there are households with multiple cases, for period 10th -24th September 2021, the majority of infections started in the child.

- Adult acquired infection first


There was a slight dip in the success of contact tracing over the summer, but since September the success rate has been over 90%.

Local Contact Tracing




Our local contact tracing team contacts all cases of covid actionable at a local level, in most recent week to 22nd September, this was 255 cases.





- Our York City covid vaccination programme continues to be delivered via Nimbus



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
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
COVID Vaccine Uptake /Demographic Influencers


INDIVIDUALS VACCINATED BY DEPRIVATION




INDIVIDUALS VACCINATED BY SEX

Our vaccination programme continues to be available for first and second doses – the offer remains for any residents who wish to have a vaccination.

- You do not need to be registered with a GP to take up a vaccination
- You can walk into any of our clinics and you'll be booked in there and then offered a vaccination
- Additional pharmacy sites being introduced

Universal offer to 12-15 year olds commenced in our area this week and is being lead by the School Immunisations Teams, not primary care. Aim is to offer the vaccination to all 12-15 year olds before half term.

Seasonal Influenza Vaccination Programme

- All GP Practices signed up to DES to deliver Seasonal Influenza vaccine program for adults
- Community Pharmacy crucial to delivery
- School vaccination teams plan to deliver expanded program to 15 yr olds
- CCG also has a contracted services with the expectation for staff to be vaccinated

There is now guidance in place for flu and covid to be co-administered, but neither programme should hold up the other, so we expect this is to be limited to a very small number of patients – most likely housebound individuals and there may be opportunities in care homes

Priority Groups as per JCVI guidance for Free vaccination

- all children aged 2 to 15 (but not 16 years or older) on 31 August 2021
- those aged 6 months to under 50 years in clinical risk groups
- pregnant women
- those aged 50 years and over
- those in long-stay residential care homes
- carers
- close contacts of immunocompromised individuals
- frontline health and social care staff employed by:
 - a registered residential care or nursing home
 - registered domiciliary care provider
 - a voluntary managed hospice provider
 - Direct Payment (personal budgets) and/or Personal Health Budgets, such as Personal Assistants.

Seasonal Influenza Vaccination Programme

Confirmation that Primary care flu clinics for priority groups have commenced

Confirmation Community pharmacy clinics have commenced

For housebound patients – practices continue to encourage as many patients as possible to attend a flu clinic. Where genuinely unable to attend a clinic – GP Practice will vaccinate.

Also have a lead practice for vaccination of homeless

Risks & Issues

- There has been varying delays in first order deliveries to some practices – delaying the commencement of the program.
- Community nursing teams are unable to provide additional support to practices for housebound patients this year due to high level of core demand on the service.

Outstanding actions:

- Revision to Flu Outbreak Policy in progress. Current review by HCV Medicines Management teams. Next steps to ensure effective mechanism for flu outbreak to be identified early in a care home, residents assessed and access / logistics to antivirals

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
