Schemes recently funded from the ward budget

Holtby

Purchase and installation of two solar light poles to illuminate village bus stops on A166 (£735 contribution from the ward).



Schemes recently funded from the ward budget

Murton Parish Council

A grant towards the purchase of a new notice board to be installed on Main Street in Murton. (£1,357)

Kexby

Funding for rock salt to refill Kexby Parish Council grit bins (£150).



Schemes recently funded from the ward budget

Osballdwick Sports Club

A grant to purchase and set up a multimedia system including projector, screen and sound system at the clubhouse. (£798)

Osballdwick Sports Club

A grant towards trees planting along the perimeter of Osballdwick Sports Club. (£336)

Improvements to St Thomas Close, Osbaldwick

Narrow strips of verge replaced with cobbles inlaid into concrete to prevent ongoing damage to grass verges.
(approx £4900 waiting for the final cost).

Planned improvements

Dropped kerbs, Intake Lane, Dunnington

To install a pair of dropped kerbs and overlay the carriageway between the footway to give a good surface for pedestrians to cross. Intake Lane, Dunnington outside no's 7-11 (approx £2000).



Planned improvements

Dunnington

To replace litter bin outside the takeaway on York Street, Dunnington. (£350)

To replace broken bin at the entrance to the play park, Intake Lane, Dunnington. (£350)

Minimum 10 bin requests required to place an order with the supplier.

Ward budget timetable 2017–18

- ▶ Community and voluntary groups are invited to submit bids for funding for schemes which support the delivery of our Ward Priorities:
 - A cleaner environment for all villager
 - Safer communities across the area
 - More community and youth opportunities
- ▶ Funding applications are invited throughout the year.

Ward budget allocation 2017–18

- ▶ Ward general/revenue budget: **£19,082** (not including carry forward amount from year 2016-17 which is yet to be confirmed).

Broken down per parish, per number of electors:

- Osbaldwick = £7,978
- Murton = £1,564
- Holtby = £439
- Kexby = £572
- Dunnington = £8,529

Ward budget allocation 2017–18

- ▶ Ward highways/capital budget: **£9,090** (plus carry forward of **£4,392** from year 2016-17).

Broken down per parish, per number of electors:

- Osbaldwick = £3,950
- Murton = £2,236
- Holtby = £627
- Kexby = £818
- Dunnington = £5,851
