Report of the Head of Internal Audit

Audit & Counter Fraud Progress Report

Summary

1 This report provides an update on the delivery of the internal audit work programme for 2021/22 and on counter fraud activity undertaken so far in the year.

Background

The work of internal audit is governed by the Accounts and Audit Regulations 2015 and the Public Sector Internal Audit Standards (PSIAS). In accordance with the standards, periodic reports on internal audit work are presented to this committee.

Internal Audit

- The 2021/22 internal audit plan was approved by this committee at its meeting on 14 April 2021.
- As noted in the Head of Internal Audit annual report to this committee on 16 June 2021, we had a higher level of outstanding 2020/21 work than would normally be expected. Much of the work that has taken place since the last report to this committee has therefore been on finalising this outstanding work.
- 5 Annex 1 provides details of the completed and ongoing internal audit work as well as plans for audit work to be completed in the remainder of 2021/22.

Counter Fraud

The counter fraud progress report is contained in annex 2. It reports on progress against the counter fraud work programme. A range of work is detailed including activity to promote awareness of fraud, work with external agencies, and information on the level of fraud reported to date.
