Progress against the Action Plan prepared in response to the Public Interest Report: Response from the Local Government Association

### **Summary**

To receive the initial report from the Local Government Association in response to the Committee's request for their views with regards the Council's approach to delivery of the Action Plan prepared in response to the Report in the Public Interest dated 19<sup>th</sup> April 2021.

## **Background**

The Council is required to address the recommendations set out in the Report in the Public Interest dated 19<sup>th</sup> April 2021, and accepted by Full Council on 4<sup>th</sup> May 2021. An Action Plan was also approved by Full Council and Audit & Governance Committee has been asked to oversee the delivery of the Action Plan.

Work to address the various aspects of the Action Plan continues.

At their meeting on 16<sup>th</sup> June 2021, the Audit & Governance Committee commissioned the support of the Local Government Association and approved their scoping document as to how support can be offered to deliver the Action Plan.
