## 3. SAFER NEIGHBOURHOODS POLICE TEAM

Safer Neighbourhood Team

Crime over all has dropped by 18.5% compared with the same time last year which means there have been 81 fewer victims of crime.

PC Andrew Thompson gave the latest crime figures: Violent Crime -19%
Burglary Dwell (house) -38%
Burglary other (garage/Shed) -26%
Crime damage – 19%
Theft from motor vehicles – 53%

A resident made comments about when contacting the police there is an automated system and his concerns about the Police team been on the same rest days.

PC Thompson answered that if there was an emergency use 999 and if the team were on rest days there is always another community officer on duty.

Jackie Armitage Street Environmental Officer gave a presentation on Love Where You Live.

Leaflets about the project were given to the residents.

## 5. KENT STREET FIRE STATION

Kent Street Fire Station Presentation

Representatives from North Yorkshire Fire and Rescue service and drivers Jonas Deloitte gave an informative presentation about the proposed Fire station in Kent Street.

They explained that the project is at the design stage, and the archaeological department, local schools and the community would be involved. If any trees had to be removed they would be replaced.

#### Questions:

A resident asked in the current financial climate why was a New Fire station been planned.

Answer: The timing of the Fire station was not planned around the current climate; the old building was over sixty years old and no longer fit for purpose.

Residents had concerns over safety near the fire station for children from local schools.

Cllr D'Agorne was reassured that the pedestrian access across the site from Kent Street to the school was being discussed with the Fishergate school head.

A resident had concerns over the levels of noise heard in certain areas in Fishergate on numerous occasions when the Peace Festival and Gay Pride were taking place.

The resident also asked for a copy of the ballot votes from 2011.12.

Cllr Taylor replied that the levels of noise are regularly monitored, and that one person's tolerance level can be different to another. He also gave out the noise parole number with is available all weekend 9.00pm -3.00am. Sally Barker has sent out the votes to the resident.
