- 13.1 Local projects Cllr A Dykes reported that the Salt Bins contract has been paid for and the new Salt bins will be installed for the winter. The Noticeboards have been ordered.

Work ongoing to open the Sports Club when allowed. Fortunate in having a lot of outside space and a few entrances and exits so a flow of people would work. Preparations ongoing. Arranging AGM is the next challenge.

- 13.4 In-Bloom Cllr J Brooks advised that a new Secretary has been appointed. Some of the Ladies have been out working.
- 13.5 Environment Cllr L Turnbull reported that the Environment group will not meet until restrictions due to Coronavirus allow.

- 13.7 Playpark Cllr J Maggs reported that the grass has been cut with the help of the Sports Club. Safety Inspections are overdue due to the Coronavirus restrictions.
