Changes to Committee Appointments

Summary

1. At the Annual Council meeting on 25 May 2017, appointments were made to Committees, Sub-Committees and Outside Bodies for the 2017/18 municipal year.
2. It is necessary to make an urgent change to the membership of the Economy & Place Policy Development Committee, in order to rectify an administrative error contained within the 'Formal Business of Council - Allocation to Seats and Appointments to the Council Structure and Outside Bodies for 2017/18 and Allocation of Motions' report to the aforementioned meeting.

Background

3. The Council makes appointments at its Annual Meeting, to Committees and Outside Bodies. As the Staffing Matters & Urgency Committee has authority to deal with any changes or appointments to those Committees and Outside Bodies, in year, the following are put forward for consideration;

Economy & Place Policy Development Committee

- To appoint Cllr Cullwick to replace Cllr Mason as a member of the above committee; and
- To appoint Cllr Hunter to replace Cllr Cullwick as a substitute representative.

Consultation

4. Normal processes to consult the relevant political Group have been applied to ensure the Group nominate the Members of their choice. No other consultation is specifically required in this instance.

Options

5. There are no alternative options available as this is simply for the Groups concerned to nominate appropriate candidates to either replace the Member concerned or to fill the position that has become available.

Council Plan

6. Maintaining an appropriate decision making and scrutiny structure and appointees to that contribute to the Council delivering its core priorities set out in the current Council Plan, effectively.
