3. MINUTES

The minutes of the Parish Council meeting held on the 8th March 2022, were considered and confirmed by the Chairman as a correct record.

4. RECEIVE REPORT FROM WARD COUNCILLORS

An update was read out from the Ward Councillors by email.

5. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Matt Joy, Jeremy Williams and Ian Waltham attended the meeting to speak to the parish council about proposals to develop the Bluebeck site into a 72 bed care facility. Torsion Care/Construction were proposed to front the scheme with Burghley Care as operator. The principal driver was the YCC's identified need for an additional 600 care beds by 2023. The proposals are to:

demolish all existing buildings as it was not operationally viable to refurb Bluebeck house

Want all homes to have an EPC rating of A

Realign road

3 storey care home

Green up the site

44% reduction in hard standing / 150% increase in landscaping

All trees retained

Secure gardens

22 car spaces and 72 beds - 10 for staff

15-18 staff on site at any time 75 staff

Application submitted – but not yet validated

Approval September – with starting next year

Adjacent Cottages to be used as site accommodation and later convert them to 2 houses for sale.

David Carruthers from Clifton Alliance Cricket Club attended the meeting to speak to the parish council regarding his submitted funding request. The following was noted:-

Around 100 years old, originally hospital cricket club

Have most teams in Yorkshire under 11s to 4 senior teams; 350 players. Entirely volunteer run

Have mixed teams but want girl's and women's' teams have just built a women's' changing room and set up two women's teams – the first two. In conjunction with York cricket club. One gone straight into N Yorks elite team

35 players signed up.

Need training kit for the teams.

Need a second portable net and bowling machine.

The opening up of cricket to women was welcome.

Decision to the funding application provided under Item 10.5 (a) – Finance.

The Limes – currently reviewing offers but cannot say more for legal reasons.

Detailed application for the library / community hub and outline for the housing. Potential for three access points for housing. Access could be anywhere on Fairway.

There is an ecology report including on the hedge. Says hedge is not rich of species, however are committed to what was said at the executive. Significant will be given to keeping as much of the hedge as possible and put in a new hedge on housing boundary

Working with school – over summer garage and cycle shelter to be moved onto the school site.

Path to fairway ahead of main work – over October half term

Contractor on board by end of year and completion within a year

Issues over housing development at same time or not whether developments would get in their way

Proposal to erect an additional sign board on Rawcliffe Drive adjacent PC noticeboard to provide project information.
