Section 100 Licensing Act 2003, The Licensing Act 2003 (Permitted Temporary Activities) (Notices) Regulations 2005 as amended by The Licensing Act 2003 (Permitted Temporary Activities) (Notices) (Amendment) Regulations 2016 and the Police Reform and Social Responsibility Act 2011:

Submission of a Temporary Event Notice (TEN) for 3 – 5 St Helen's Square, York, YO1 8QN.

Summary

- 1. This report seeks Members' determination of a Temporary Event Notice (TEN) submitted under the Licensing Act 2003 to authorise the sale by retail of alcohol, provision of regulated entertainment and provision of late night refreshment for a two day event scheduled to take place on 25 & 26 November 2021.
- 2. Reference number: CYC- 62992
- 3. Name of premises user: Stephanie Powell
- 4. Type of authorisation applied for: Temporary Event Notice
- 5. Summary of application: The nature of the TEN is to allow for the sale by retail of alcohol, the provision of regulated entertainment and the provision of late night refreshment for a private student society event. The event is scheduled to take place in the restaurant, bar and tea room of Impossible at 3 and 5 St Helen's Square York on 25 and 26 November 2021 from 22.00 hours until at 03.00 hours for an occupancy of 230 people. These timings are outside the existing premises licence/s permitted licensable hours which terminates at 01.00 hours.

Background

- 6. A TEN authorises the provision of licensable activities on a temporary basis without the need for a premises licence or club premises certificate. A TEN is submitted by a 'premises user' who is an individual aged over 18 years. A TEN is subject to various restrictions, one of which includes limiting the maximum number of people attending the event at any one time to less than 499.
- 7. The police and environmental protection officers (EPU) can object to a TEN on the grounds that it would undermine any of the four licensing objectives;
 - The prevention of crime and disorder;
 - Public safety;
 - The prevention of public nuisance; and
 - The protection of children from harm.
- 8. As a result of an objection conditions from an existing premises licence can be attached to the TEN.
- 9. A copy of the TEN is attached at Annex 1.
- 10. A copy of the existing premises licence/s is attached at Annex 2. Number 3 and number 5 St Helen's Square each have their own premises licence. The TEN applied for states the licensable activities will take place in both number 3 & number 5.

Promotion of Licensing Objectives

11. There is no requirement for a premises user to indicate how the licensing objectives will be met and there is no provision on the TEN application form to allow for this information to be entered.

Special Policy Consideration

12. This premises is located within the special policy area.

Consultation

13. Consultation was carried out by the premises user in accordance with S100 Licensing Act 2003 and The Licensing Act 2003 (Permitted Temporary Activities) (Notices) Regulations 2005 as amended by The Licensing Act 2003 (Permitted Temporary

- Activities) (Notices) (Amendment) Regulations 2012. The premises user complied with all statutory requirements.
- 14. All procedural aspects concerning the submission of the TEN and the submission of the notices of objection have been complied with.

Summary of Objections

- 15. An objection to the TEN has been received from North Yorkshire Police on the grounds the prevention of crime and disorder, prevention of public nuisance, public safety and the protection of children from harm licensing objectives will be undermined if the event is to take place. A copy of the objection is attached at Annex 3.
- 16. An objection to the TEN has been received from the Public Protection Team at the City of York Council on the grounds the prevention of public nuisance and the protection of children from harm licensing objectives will be undermined if the event is to take place. A copy of the objection is attached at Annex 4.

Options

- 17. By virtue of s106 of the Act, the Committee have the following options available to them in making their decision: -
- 18. Option 1: Modify the terms of the TEN.
- 19. Option 2: Issue a counter notice refusing authorisation of the TEN.
- 20. Option 3: Choose not to issue a counter notice

Analysis

- 21. The following could be the result of any decision made this Sub Committee:-
- 22. Option 1: This decision could be appealed at Magistrates Court by the premises user or the objector.
- 23. Option 2: This decision could be appealed at Magistrates Court by the premises user.
- 24. Option 3: This decision could be appealed at Magistrates Court by the objector.

Council Plan

- 25. The Licensing Act 2003 has 4 objectives the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety, prevention of public nuisance and the protection of children from harm.
- 26. By taking the statutory requirements of the Licensing Act into consideration, as well as the four licensing objectives when determining licensing applications the Council are supporting the new and existing licence trade, as well as local residents and businesses. The functions support the Council's Plan of safe communities and culture for all, and a good quality of life for everyone.

Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

MANDATORY CONDITIONS IN RELATION TO THE SUPPLY OF ALCOHOL

- 1. In accordance with section 19 of the Licensing Act 2003, where a premises licence authorises the supply of alcohol, the licence must include the following conditions.
- 2. The first condition is that no supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence
 - a) at a time where there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 3. The second condition is that every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 4. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises
 - a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage individuals to –
 - i. drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - ii. drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- 5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

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- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either
 - a) a holographic mark, or
 - b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 7. The responsible person must ensure that
 - a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures –
 - i. beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - ii. gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and
 - iii. still wine in a glass: 125ml;
 - b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

MANDATORY CONDITION - ALCOHOL PRICING

- 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1
 - a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula $-P = D + (D \times V)$ where -
 - i. P is the permitted price,
 - ii. D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - iii. V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
 - c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence –
 - i. the holder of the premises licence,
 - ii. the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - iii. the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
 - d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
 - e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

MANDATORY CONDITION: DOOR SUPERVISION

- 1. In accordance with section 21 of the Licensing Act 2003 (as amended by section 25 Violent Crime Reduction Act 2006), where a premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, the licence must include a condition that each such individual must
 - a) be authorised to carry out that activity by a licence granted under the Private Security Industry Act 2001; or
 - b) be entitled to carry out that activity by virtue of section 4 of that Act.
- 2. But nothing in subsection (1) requires such a condition to be imposed -

- 3. For the purposes of this section
 - a) "security activity" means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies, and which is licensable conduct for the purposes of that Act (see section 3(2) of that Act), and
 - b) paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.

MANDATORY CONDITION: EXHIBITION OF FILMS

- 1. In accordance with section 20 of the Licensing Act 2003, where a premises licence authorises the exhibition of films, the licence must include a condition requiring the admission of children to the exhibition of any film to be restricted in accordance with this section.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating schedule Licensing Objectives

- 2. All doors and windows shall be closed after 23:00 hours when regulated entertainment is taking place.

Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

- 1. The premises shall trade predominantly as a tea rooms and restaurant on the ground floor and cocktail club to the first floor, with a 'speakeasy' style cocktail bar to the rear of the ground floor premises along with upper roof terraces.

- The ground floor outside area shall be closed by 2200hrs daily. The roof terraces shall close and be cleared of patrons by 2100hrs daily (with the exception of New Year's Eve).
- 6. The licence holder will operate a Challenge 25 Age Verification Policy at the premises.
- 7. The only acceptable proof of age identification shall be a current Passport, photo card Driving Licence, Military ID card, or identification carrying the PASS logo (until other effective identification technology e.g thumb print or pupil recognition, is adopted by the Premises Licence Holder).
- 8. No adult entertainment shall take place before 2130hrs.
- 9. No person under the age of 18 will be permitted on the premises when any adult entertainment is taking place and in the 30 minute periods before and after such entertainment takes place.
- 10. Any adult entertainment must be restricted to the first and second floor areas only and must not take place on roof terraces or any outside area. When such events take place there shall be screens to prevent such entertainment being viewed by other members of the public and the Designated Premises Supervisor or Premises Licence holder shall ensure that a risk assessment is conducted. Customers must be seated during the performance and there is to be no physical contact between customers and performers.

- Advertising for adult entertainment shall not be displayed on the premises at a time when persons aged under 18 are on the premises.
- 12. A digital colour CCTV system will be installed to cover the premises and recorded coverage will include all areas (including outside areas) to which the public have access.
 - It will be maintained, working and recording at all times when the premises are open.
 - The recordings should be of good evidential quality to be produced in Court or other such hearing.
 - Copies of the recordings will be kept available for any Responsible Authority for 28 days.

15. A Refusals Register and Incident Report Register will be kept. Such documents will record incidents of staff refusals of alcohol sales to under-age or drunk people as well as incidents of any anti-social behaviour and ejections from the premises.

Such records shall be kept for at least one year. (For the avoidance of doubt, the one year period relates to each respective entry in the log book and runs from the date of that particular entry). They will be made available immediately upon request from any Responsible Authority.

- 16. The sale of alcohol shall cease 30 minutes before close of business on any given day to allow for 'drinking up' time.
- 17. All off sales shall be in sealed containers (with the exception of the pavement café licence area).
- 18. No drinks or drinking glasses shall be taken out of the licensed premises or (licensed area) onto the pavement or highway with the exception of any pavement café licence area.
- 19. Members of staff will monitor, clear and keep tidy the outside areas, and a supervisor will conduct an additional check on every hour that the area is used. .
- 20. There shall be a personal licence holder on duty per floor at the premises at all busy times when they are open for licensable activities. In addition, the DPS or a Personal Licence holder shall be present on the premises during the whole time that adult entertainment is taking place.
- 21. Clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all exits and roof terraces requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and area quietly.
- 22. No licensable activities shall take place at the premises until a documented smoking policy has been submitted to and agreed by the Public Protection Department of City of York Council. The policy shall thereafter be implemented as approved.
- 23. A zero tolerance towards illegal drugs will be enforced at all times.
- 24. All instances of crime and disorder will be reported to the Police and will be kept in an incident log book.

The Premises Management shall ensure compliance with all aspects of the approved Noise Management Plan.
- No licensable activities shall take place at the premises until a documented dispersal 32. policy has been submitted to and approved in writing by the Public Protection Department of the City of York Council. The Premises Management shall ensure compliance with all aspects of the approved dispersal policy.

MANDATORY CONDITIONS IN RELATION TO THE SUPPLY OF ALCOHOL

- 2. A minimum number of 40 seats shall be provided for customers on the ground floor.
- 3. The outside area shall be closed by 2200hrs daily
- 4. The licence holder will operate a Challenge 25 Age Verification Policy at the premises.
- 5. The only acceptable proof of age identification shall be a current Passport, photo card Driving Licence, Military ID card, or identification carrying the PASS logo (until other effective identification technology e.g. thumb print or pupil recognition, is adopted by the Premises Licence Holder).
- 6. No adult entertainment shall take place at the premises.
- 7. The sale of alcohol in all parts of the premises shall only be by waiter/waitress service to seated customers, and there shall be no sales of alcohol over the bars directly to the customer.
- 8. The outside area shall be closed by 2200hrs daily.
- 9. A digital colour CCTV system will be installed to cover the premises and recorded coverage will include all areas (including outside areas) to which the public have access.
 - It will be maintained, working and recording at all times when the premises are open
 - The recordings should be of good evidential quality to be produced in Court or other such hearing.

- Copies of the recordings will be kept available for any Responsible Authority for 28 days.
- Copies of the recordings shall be made available to any Responsible Authority within 48 hrs upon request.
- Copies of the recordings will display the correct time and date of the recording.
- It is the responsibility of the management to ensure that there are sufficient members of staff available during the hours of operation to be able to download evidence from the CCTV system at the request of the police or responsible authority.
- 10. Door Supervisors shall be employed as follows: -
 - (a) On Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays leading into a bank holiday Monday the use of door supervisors shall be risk assessed in conjunction with the operation of Impossible next door.
 - (b) On days when race meetings are held at York Racecourse (save for the family meeting held in September and the first meeting in May) a min of 1 SIA licensed door staff shall be provided at the premises from 19:00 hours to the close of business.
- 10.1 The management of the premises will comply with any written, reasonable and justified request made by North Yorkshire Police regarding the provision of Door Supervisors should the need arise at other times.
- 10.2 When employed, door staff will wear high visibility arm bands.
- 11. Documented staff training will be given regarding staff's obligation under the Licensing Act 2003 in respect of the:-
 - Retail sale of alcohol
 - Age verification policy
 - Conditions attached to the Premises Licence
 - Permitted Licensable activities
 - The Licensing objectives and
 - The Opening Times of the venue.

Such records shall be kept for a minimum of one year and will be made available immediately upon request from any Responsible Authority.

- 12. A Refusals Register and Incident Report Register will be kept. Such documents will record incidents of staff refusals of alcohol sales to under-age or drunk people as well as incidents of any anti-social behaviour and ejections from the premises.
 - Such records shall be kept for at least one year. (For the avoidance of doubt, the one year period relates to each respective entry in the log book and runs from the date of that particular entry). They will be made available immediately upon request from any Responsible Authority.
- 13. The sale of alcohol (other than to residents of the hotel and their bona fide guests) shall cease 30 minutes before close of business on any given day to allow for 'drinking up' time.
- 14. All off sales shall be in sealed containers (with the exception of the pavement café licence area).
- 15. No drinks or drinking glasses shall be taken out of the licensed premises or (licensed area) onto the pavement or highway with the exception of any pavement café licence area.

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- 16. Members of staff will monitor, clear and keep tidy the outside areas, and a supervisor will conduct an additional check on every hour that the area is used.
- 17. Clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and area quietly.
- 18. No licensable activities shall take place at the premises until a documented smoking policy has been submitted to and agreed by the Public Protection Department of the City of York Council. The policy shall thereafter be implemented as approved.
- 19. A zero tolerance towards illegal drugs will be enforced at all times
- 20. All instances of crime and disorder will be reported to the police and will be kept in an incident log book.
- 21. The Premises will comply take part in and comply with any crime reduction initiatives, when requested to do so by a responsible authority.
- 22. The Premises Licence Holder will comply with any instructions issued by the Police regarding closure on race days and/or other sporting events.
- 23. The Premises Licence Holder shall ensure so far as possible that when an exclusion order is made, the person subject to the order is denied access to the premise.
- 25. A tamper-proof noise-limiting device shall be fitted to the sound system within the premises and all music played at the premises must pass through this noise limiting device at a level first agreed by the Council's Public Protection section. The device shall not be altered or modified without prior agreement with the Council's Public Protection section. The device must be of a type and in a location approved in writing by the Council's Public Protection section.
- 26. Speakers shall not be located /operated on any external area.
- 27. No regulated entertainment shall take in any outside area.
- 28. No licensable activities shall take place at the premises until a written Noise Management Plan has been submitted to and approved in writing by the Public Protection Department of the City of York Council. The Noise Management Plan will include a procedure for investigating noise complaints received from the premises and a map identifying the sound check locations following any such complaint. The Premises Management shall ensure compliance with all aspects of the approved Noise Management Plan.
- 29. No licensable activities shall take place at the premises until a documented dispersal policy has been submitted to and approved in writing by Public Protection Department of the City of York Council. The Premises Management shall ensure compliance with all aspects of the approved dispersal policy.
- 30. The only licensable activity that is authorised to take place in the hotel bedrooms is the sale of alcohol by retail through a mini bar or room service. No other licensable activity will take place in the hotel bedrooms.
- 31. With the exception of hotel residents and their bona fide guests, no alcohol shall be sold or supplied on the ground floor of the premises between 0200hrs and 0800hrs.
- 32. The supply of alcohol on the basement, first and second floors of the premises shall be to hotel residents and their bona fide guests only.

Notice of Objection

Temporary Event Notice for Impossible 3-5 St Helens Square, York

Dear Licensing Authority,

I acknowledge receipt of the Temporary Event Notice (TEN) submitted by Miss Stephanie Jayne Powell, for Impossible Wonderbar & Tea rooms 3-5 St Helens Square, York, received by North Yorkshire Police on 5th November 2021 and which relates to licensable activities between the following times:-

2200hrs-0300hrs on 25th November 2021- 26th November 2021

The purpose of this letter is to serve notice on you under Section 104(2) Licensing Act 2003 of my objection to Miss Powell's Temporary Event Notice.

I believe that granting the TEN would undermine the following licensing objectives:-

- The Prevention of Crime and Disorder
- The Prevention of Public Nuisance
- Public Safety
- Protection of Children from Harm

The reasons for my objection are outlined below:-

Impossible Wonderbar and Tea Rooms is located in the Red Zone of York's Cumulative Impact Area, identified as such due to the concentration of licensed premises and the alcohol fuelled Crime and disorder and Anti-social behaviour already experienced in the vicinity. It is imperative that licensed premises within this area have robust operating conditions to ensure the promotion of all 4 licensing objectives.





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Both premises (3 & 5 St Helens Sq) do have existing Premises Licences, issued under CYC-67635 and CYC-67636, with the Premise Licence Holder for both being Tokyo Industries (Yorkshire) Ltd and permit licensable activities on the day applied for (Thursday) from 0800-0100hrs only. The licences, alongside mandatory licensing conditions, both have 2 conditions attached under Annex 2 and a further 32 conditions each added following a licensing hearing under Annex 3 (please refer to licences for full list of conditions). Conditions which were put in place in order to mitigate risk and promote the licensing objectives in this special policy area.

The applicant has chosen to apply for a TEN for their event and not operate under the Premise Licence. As such if this TEN were to be granted then both the mandatory and additional conditions on the licence for both premises would not have to be adhered to. This would allow the premises to operate in whichever way they saw fit without consequences.

North Yorkshire Police would not support the premises operating in the Cumulative Impact area with no conditions in place to mitigate risk likely leading to additional crime and disorder and public nuisance and compromising public safety. This would put further strain on local resources in this busy city centre venue.

On the Temporary Event Notice where it states, please describe the nature of the event below the applicant has stated:-

'PRIVATE EVENT, TICKETED, STUDENT SOCIETY'

It also states 'DJ 1pm-3am'

After repeated attempts to contact the applicant via phone and email and having received no contact back I am unable to gain any further information about this event. I cannot see this event advertised on the website for the premises and therefore cannot gain any further information.

North Yorkshire Police strongly believe that if licensable activities were to be permitted under a Temporary Event Notice for an event with licensable activities from 2200hrs-0300hrs on a Thursday evening without control measures in place in the Cumulative Impact Zone with no mandatory or operating conditions, the licensing objectives of The Prevention of Crime and Disorder, Public Safety, Prevention of Public Nuisance and Protection of Children From Harm would be undermined. Consequently, North Yorkshire Police do not support this Temporary Event Notice.

Annex 4

I have considered the temporary event notice for the proposed temporary event on 25 – 26 November 2021 at 3 - 5 St Helen's Square and have tried to contact the applicant to mediate conditions, however, I have been unable to do so and have concerns about both the protection of children from harm and public nuisance from the event.

The premises

The application as it stands is for the use of both 3 and 5 St Helen's Square. Both premises are in the **CIA**: the cumulative impact Area and is an area designated by City of York Council in its statement of licensing policy where evidence shows that the cumulative impact of the number and concentration of licensed premises continue to adversely affect residents, visitors and other businesses and therefore adversely affecting the promotion of the licensing objectives of prevention of crime and disorder and prevention of public nuisance. A red zone has also been identified by the local licensing authority in this area due to the high concentration of licensed premises, the impact of which have led to a high level of occurrences in relation to crime and disorder related issues.

The premises Licences

The two premises licence's for 3 St Helen's Square and 5 St Helen's Square were considered at a committee hearing in April this year, due to concerns raised by the Local licensing Authority, Public Protection and the Police and the opening hours that were applied for were withdrawn and extra conditions were attached to both premises licence's.

The event

The temporary event notice would seek to extend the licensable activities and include a DJ, beyond those agreed at committee and remove all licensing conditions imposed on the premises licence by the Committee members. Further to this the applicant has not offered to implement these nor have they offered anything to support the four licensing objectives and protect children from harm or prevent a public nuisance from occurring.

Summary

As this premises is in the red zone of the CIA and the application would remove all licensing conditions agreed by Committee in respect to the four licensing objectives and no mitigation has been proposed, Public protection are making representation due to the protection of children from harm and the prevention of public nuisance and would advise that this application is not permitted.
