



Report to the Director of City and Environmental Services

Aldreth Grove: Results of the consultation on a Residents' Priority Parking Scheme

Summary

1. The consultation with residents of Aldreth Grove, Cameron Grove, St Clement's Grove, Norfolk Street (part) and Bishopthorpe Road (part), Micklegate Ward, has now been completed.

Sufficient support has not been received from the whole area, however results broken down by individual streets does show a majority support in Aldreth Grove, Cameron Grove and Bishopthorpe Road. The results are shown in the attached table (Annex A).

To take forward a Residents' Priority Parking Scheme we ask for a 50% return of ballot sheets and a majority of the returns to be in favour before we initiate an amendment to the Traffic Regulation Order. This percentage was not reached for the balloted properties on Norfolk Street or St Clements Grove. As such we have designed a revised scheme to incorporate the results which does not include these streets.

Recommendations

2. Approval is requested to formally advertise a revised 24hour Residents Priority Parking scheme (Annex B) to include Aldreth Grove, Cameron Grove and Bishopthorpe Road (property numbers 104 to 154) as an amendment to the Traffic Regulation Order. Any objections received will be brought back for consideration by Executive Member of Transport and Planning and a further decision made. Residents will be informed by letter of the results on the consultation and the proposed traffic order at the same time as advertising on street.

If the proposed scheme goes to implementation it is also requested, within this report, to approve a decision so that if any future requests or petitions are received from the already balloted streets (i.e. Norfolk Street and St Clements Grove) the council will have prior approval to formally consult with them to be included within this new Residents Parking scheme (which includes Aldreth Grove) and will not be considered for a scheme of their own.

Background

3. A petition representing 54% of households on Aldreth Grove was received earlier this year. This was considered at a Decision Session along with further comments received from properties on Bishopthorpe Road, St Clements Grove and Cameron Grove after they heard of the petition. The Director of City and Environmental Services in consultation with the Executive Member for Transport decided to undertake a formal consultation with residents of Aldreth Grove and surrounding streets at the same time, please see Annex C for the originally consulted area.

Consultation

4. Residents were consulted in October 2015 and asked to return a ballot sheet in order to register their preference. A break down of each street and there returns is included on Annex A.

A précis of comments received from residents are included as Annex D. Ward councillor comments have been included in Annex E.

Analysis

5. Historically, Residents' Priority Parking Schemes are formally proposed for advertising when we receive 50% of ballot sheets and the majority of those who expressed a preference are in favour of a scheme. We have not received this on all streets which were balloted; as such the scheme has been broken down to include the streets in preference of a scheme rather than overall results.

Options

- 6. The options available are:
 - A. Approve the revised 24hour Residents Priority Parking scheme for legally advertising, as detailed in attached plan (Annex B) along with approval for any further requests received from the original area to be formally consulted to be included within this scheme. (recommended action)
 - B. Approve the revised scheme for advertising as detailed in attached plan (Annex B)
 - C. Approve the original scheme, as a whole, for advertising. This is not the recommended action as on some streets the majority of residents did not vote in favour of a scheme.
 - D. Take no further action.

Council Plan

7. The potential benefits for the priorities in the Council Plan are:

A council who listens to its residents; The decision requested confirms the participation of residents in the decision making process and democratic life.

8. **Financial** –.Cost of advertising the proposal would be approximately £1000, this would be financed from the 2015/2016 budget for Residents Priority Parking.


