Planned improvements

Improvements to St Thomas Close, Osbaldwick To replace the narrow strips of verge with cobbles inlaid into concrete. The flags will remain in place, the triangular pieces of verge at the entrance to the Close will remain and a tree will be planted on one side to match the other side. Cast Iron bollards will be placed on both corners (approx £4900).
