Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

MANDATORY CONDITIONS WHERE LICENCE AUTHORISES SUPPLY OF ALCOHOL

(1) In accordance with section 19 of the Licensing Act 2003, where a premises licence authorises the supply of alcohol, the licence must include the following conditions.

(2) The first condition is that no supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence -

(a) at a time where there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or

(b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

(3) The second condition is that every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

MANDATORY CONDITION: EXHIBITION OF FILMS

(1) In accordance with section 20 of the Licensing Act 2003, where a premises licence authorises the exhibition of films, the licence must include a condition requiring the admission of children to the exhibition of any film to be restricted in accordance with this section.

(2) Where the film classification body is specified in the licence, unless subsection (3)(b) applies, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that body.

(3) Where -

(a) the film classification body is not specified in the licence, or

(b) the relevant licensing authority has notified the holder of the licence that this subsection applies to the film in question, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that licensing authority.

(4) In this section - 'children' means persons aged under 18; and 'film classification body' means the person or persons designated as the authority under section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 (c.39) (authority to determine suitability of video works for classification).

MANDATORY CONDITION: DOOR SUPERVISION

(1) In accordance with section 21 of the Licensing Act 2003 (as amended by section 25 Violent Crime Reduction Act 2006), where a premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, the licence must include a condition that each such individual must -

(a) be authorised to carry out that activity by a licence granted under the Private Security Industry Act 2001; or

(b) be entitled to carry out that activity by virtue of section 4 of that Act.

(2) But nothing in subsection (1) requires such a condition to be imposed -
(a) in respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c.12) (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films), or
(b) in respect of premises in relation to -
(i) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence, or
(ii) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act).

(3) For the purposes of this section -
(a) "security activity" means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies, and which is licensable conduct for the purposes of that Act (see section 3(2) of that Act), and
(b) paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.

SCHEDULE 3

STANDARD PRE-EXISTING CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO ON LICENCE WITH CHILDREN'S CERTIFICATE AND SECTION 77 SPECIAL HOURS CERTIFICATE

Children

1. No person under fourteen shall be in the bar of the licensed premises during the permitted hours unless one of the following applies:

- a) He is the child of the holder of the premises licence
- b) He resides in the premises, but is not employed there
- c) He is in the bar solely for the purpose of passing to or from some part of the premises which is not a bar and to or from which there is no other convenient means of access or egress
- d) The bar is in railway refreshment rooms or other premises constructed, fitted and intended to be used bona fide for any purpose to which the holding of the licence is ancillary
- e) i) he is in an area shown on the plan attached to the Licence,
ii) meals and non-alcoholic beverages are available for sale for consumption in that area
iii) he is in the company of a person aged 18 or over and
iv) he is there prior to 21:00.

In this condition bar includes any place exclusively or mainly used for the consumption of intoxicating liquor. But an area is not a bar when it is usual for it to be, and it is set apart for the service of table meals and alcohol is only sold or supplied to persons as an ancillary to their table meals.

Credit Sales

2. Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied unless it is paid for before, or at the time when it is sold or supplied, except alcohol sold or supplied:

- a) with and for consumption at a meal supplied at the same time, consumed with the meal and paid for together with the meal
- b) for consumption by a person residing in the premises or his guest and paid for together with his accommodation
- c) to a canteen or mess.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

Licensing Objectives

General

- 1) The premises operates within the high standards set by Company policies.
- 2) There shall be no happy hours or irresponsible drinks promotions.

Prevention of Crime & Disorder

- 3) Internal and external CCTV is in operation within the premise, tapes are kept for 31 days.
- 4) The Manager will take an active part in local pub watch meetings.
- 5) The premise is in radio contact with other licensed premises.

Public Safety

- 6) There is always a trained first aider on the premise.
- 7) Free drinking water is available and non-alcoholic beverages on sale throughout opening hours.

Public Nuisance

- 8) A noise limiter is installed for amplified music. Quadruple glazing is installed to ensure music cannot be heard at the nearest noise sensitive premise.

Protection of Children from Harm

- 9) Only photographic ID such as passport and UK driving licence will be accepted as proof of age.

For Regulated Entertainment consisting of Music and Dancing

- a) The licence holder shall attach a copy of the City Council's Rules for the Management of Places of Public Entertainment to the valid licence. This document shall form part of the licence.
- b) The licence holder shall ensure prompt compliance with any written report received from the City Council.
- c) The licence holder shall ensure prompt compliance with any written report received from North Yorkshire Fire and Rescue Service.

d) The maximum occupancy of the licensed premises shall not exceed the
Maximum Occupancy - 560 persons

NB: No part of the premises other than the area(s) specified above shall be used for purposes
permitted by this licence.
