- Action plans submitted to LEA.
- Staff from secondary schools invited to meetings.

MODEL 4

Activities may include:

• As in models 1, 2 + 3

Additionally may provide:

- 7am 7pm provision for 52 weeks of the year
- daycare provision in partnership with VIP sector on school site
- Family Centre provision on school site
- Services for wider community on school site
- Neighbourhood Nursery on school site
- Fully inclusive provision on site
