Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

MANDATORY CONDITIONS WHERE LICENCE AUTHORISES SUPPLY OF ALCOHOL

(1) In accordance with section 19 of the Licensing Act 2003, where a premises licence authorises the supply of alcohol, the licence must include the following conditions.

(2) The first condition is that no supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence -

(a) at a time where there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or

(b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

(3) The second condition is that every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

MANDATORY CONDITION: DOOR SUPERVISION

(1) In accordance with section 21 of the Licensing Act 2003 (as amended by section 25 Violent Crime Reduction Act 2006), where a premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security

activity, the licence must include a condition that each such individual must -

(a) be authorised to carry out that activity by a licence granted under the Private Security Industry Act 2001; or

(b) be entitled to carry out that activity by virtue of section 4 of that Act.

(2) But nothing in subsection (1) requires such a condition to be imposed -

(a) in respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c.12) (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films), or

(b) in respect of premises in relation to -

(i) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence, or

(ii) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act).

(3) For the purposes of this section -

(a) "security activity" means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies, and which is licensable conduct for the purposes of that Act (see section 3(2) of that Act), and

(b) paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

Licensing Objectives

General

1) Signs and notices clearly showing the opening, closing and drinking up times will be visible to both guests on and off the premise.

2) Any adult entertainment will be limited to music videos that from time to time may include content of an adult nature and live entertainment that from time to time may include semi nudity or contain provocative actions.

Prevention of Crime & Disorder

3) Door supervisors will be reassigned towards the end of each trading period to take a visible presence outside the premise and act as marshalls. The use of venue security staff as marshalls will always be in negotiation with the police and will be kept under review.

4) Marshalls will wear high visibility clothing, work closely to the venue and be in direct communication with the venue.

5) The premise will provide a cloakroom to provide secure storage of personal belongings on busy evenings, with staffing and control systems increased in the period prior to closure to assist the swift return of belongings.

6) CCTV will be installed to cover both the outside and inside of the premises. It will be maintained and working at all times during which the premises are open. Copies of the recordings will be kept available for any relevant authority for 14 days.

7) At busy times, when queuing is necessary, Door Supervisors will ensure that the queue forms along the front of the premises along George Hudson Street and into Tanner Row. All reasonable steps will be taken to ensure that the queue does not cause an obstruction of the footpath.

8) Subject to planning permission being obtained from the City of York Council and at your expense, the barrier presently situated at the corner of George Hudson Street and Tanner Row will be extended along the front of the premises (George Hudson Street facia) to mirror the boundary of the premises.

Public Safety

9) Signs will be displayed informing customers that they are not allowed to take bottles or glasses from the premise. This will be supported by a vigilant door team, customers will be searched where necessary.

10) Bins and tables will be provided at or near exits for use by customers to leave glasses or discard bottles before leaving.

11) During the last hour of trading the service points in each bar will be reduced and staff reallocated to collect glasses or work in the cloakroom assisting customer departure.

12) Periodic electrical installation tests will be carried out by a qualified person once every three years to the standards required by the licensing authority.

Public Nuisance

13) The door team will encourage customers to drink up and progress to the exits within the venue throughout the latter part of the drinking up time.

14) The door team will ask customers to leave the premise quietly.

15) The door team will ensure removal of all bottles and glasses from departing customers.

16) The door team will actively encourage customers not to congregate outside the venue.

17) The door team will direct customers to the nearest taxi ranks or other transportation away from the area.

18) A rubbish patrol will be sent out following the closure of the premise, the patrol will pick up litter in the immediate vicinity of the premises.

19) A member of management will be in the vicinity of the main exit to oversee the end of night departure period. DJ announcments will be used to remind customers to be considerate on leaving the premises and highly visible notices will be placed in the foyer requesting exiting customers to leave quietly and to respect neighbours and their properties.

20) Patrons who persistently disregard neighbours or who are unwilling to conform to staff requests will be barred from entering on future occasions.

21) A concierge service will be provided offering a safe place for customers to wait for taxis, particularly lone females.

22) Free phone numbers for taxi's will be provided along with details of nearby taxi ranks, bus timetables and other local transport networks.

23) Lighting levels will be manipulated to encourage the gradual dispersal of patrons.

Protection of Children from Harm

24) Notices and signs will be clearly displayed at the entrance stating the age and entry policy.

25) Internal age checks will be carried out by security staff at regular intervals to back up checks carried out at the entrance to the premise.

Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

1) Noise attenuation measures, with particular regard to the fire exit onto Tanner Row, shall be agreed with the local licensing authority and maintained to its satisfaction thereafter.

2) A dispersal policy shall be agreed with the local licensing authority before the licence comes into operation and adhered to thereafter.
