Public protection object to the above application on grounds of public nuisance. We have been unable to agree conditions that will safeguard against noise and anti social behaviour and will therefore be making representations against the premises license grant.

Below are a list of conditions that we would like to attach to any approved premises license grant.

The prevention of public nuisance

1. Clear notices shall be prominently displayed requesting customers to leave the premises and the area in a quiet and orderly manner.
2. On any occasion that regulated entertainment is carried on at the premises, regular assessments of the noise emanating from the premises will be undertaken. Wherever said assessments indicate that noise is likely to cause nuisance to any local residents, remedial action will be taken. A written record will be maintained detailing the time of the noise assessments, the location where the noise monitoring took place, the identity of the person undertaking the assessment, the results of the assessment and any remedial action undertaken.
3. The management of the premises will ensure that the area immediately outside the premises is kept clean, tidy and free from litter.
4. Whenever regulated entertainment is taking place, doors and windows will be kept closed, except for the purposes of access and egress.
5. The premises will have a written dispersal policy designed to encourage patrons to leave the venue and the area quickly and quietly.
