Scheme aids social distancing on narrow footways at a location with pedestrians are queuing for essential access to facilities.

Proposal:

The lane between Bootham Terrace and Scarborough Bridge running along the side of the Railway line at the west edge of Marygate Car Park is too narrow for pedestrians and cyclist to pass whilst keeping 2m apart. Following a request by the Executive Member for Transport to provide more space in the area, the possibility of removing the parking from the line of bays along this side of the car park has been investigated. Proposed layout on attached drawing (Annex 1)

- Cones will be placed at approx. 2m spacing.
- Signs to be provided at either end of Car Park

COVID19 - CYCLISTS USE EDGE OF CAR PARK AND KEEP LEFT

If they take out one section of the birds mouth fence every 20m this should enable walkers to pass each other. Combined with the removal of short sections of birds mouth fence this arrangement would provide additional space for cyclists/pedestrians. Car Parking levels are currently relatively low and the removal of the approx. 50 spaces is unlikely to impact on parking income. This would need to be reviewed as lockdown eases. The measures are likely to cost under £1k.

It is therefore recommended to implement to provide additional room for social distancing in accordance with statutory guidance.

To provide additional room for social distancing in accordance with statutory guidance for cyclists and pedestrians.
