DMO Comment on the evidence as a whole

The application was made for the route shown as A-B-C on the map below. However the user evidence forms reasonably allege the existence of A-B-D as well as A-B-C. This is the reason for including both routes on the order. The breakdown of users between the various routes shown is 11 people claim to use A-B-C, 9 people claim to use A-B-D and 5 people claim a third route (NB people recorded more than one route per form hence 25 routes from 18 forms).

A photograph taken in 1972 clearly shows the building over the route at C on the map below. These buildings are shown on all the maps and aerial photographs available to CYC up to 1971. By 1982 the buildings had disappeared and the user evidence appears to show that a route or routes across the land were in regular use.

Dear Russell,


I am writing on behalf of all three ward councillors for Westfield to support the "Y" shaped Public Right of Way as we have received representations from residents who use both entrances onto the field from the Foxwood Lane at both points C and D. There has been concern raised by barbed wire at the gate at point D. Some residents have questioned the route A to B as whilst it is much better represented in Map 2, there are two routes used.


We are concerned about the maintenance of access to the path due to ploughing close to the edge and would ask that there is particular consideration on how this can be maintained.

Some residents have questioned the positioning of new fencing, although this is not on the land owned by the council.

The "lockdown" period and subsequent partial relaxation has meant that more people than ever are taking walks in this area and so it has become an even more valued part of the local area.

There are other local public rights of way off Grange Lane and Westfield Place that residents have asked to be resolved as attempts have been made to reduce access to these.


