a) General – all four licensing objectives (b, c, d, e) (please read guidance note 10) Ensure the licensing objectives are displayed for all staff to see and that they know and understand them.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

Create a friendly atmosphere by demonstrating good conduct and core values at all times. Spotting antisocial behaviour quickly and dealing with it discreetly.

Understanding and identifying when it is an appropriate time to act upon or report undesirable or illegal behaviour.

Ensuring staff are trained in company expectations for conduct, and that any antisocial behaviour is dealt with and reported to the manager.

c) Public safety

To ensure that Bison café bar is a safe space for all customers, and that they feel comfortable. Staff should ensure customer safety is always the first priority.

Display 'Ask For Angela' posters in the toilet, and ensure staff are trained to respond to consequential requests.

To remove any hazards which may be a risk to the public at all times.

To ensure safety precautions are taken prior to all daily activities and business operations.

To make sure safety equipment and supplies are available and that all staff understand how to access and use them.

To ensure staff are always working in a safe and cautious manner, and understand the potential dangers in the café.

Staff must report to the management any public safety issues which may arise during trading hours.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

All staff must be confident with engaging with the public, and be able to either deal with personally or report to the management at evidence of public nuisance.

When serving customers, it is ultimately the manager's responsibility to judge whether the customer can be served. Staff on duty can make that judgement, but are not liable.

Anyone causing public nuisance on the premises or in designated outdoor areas will be asked to leave the premises. If this fails, the person causing the nuisance should be warned that the police will be called if they do not cease their behaviour.

If this fails, police should be called.

NO STAFF SHOULD ATTEMPT TO RESTRAIN OR INTERVENE WITH A MEMBER OF THE PUBLIC CAUSING NUISANCE, UNLESS OTHER CUSTOMERS ARE AT SERIOUS RISK AND IF THE STAFF MEMBER FEELS CONFIDENT IN INTERVENING. STAFF ARE NOT OBLIGED TO GET INVOLVED IN ANY DISPUTES.

IF SUPPORT IS NEEDED, THE MANAGER SHOULD BE CALLED FOR HELP.

e) The protection of children from harm

When selling alcohol, use the 'Challenge 25' initiative and ask for photo ID where appropriate. Decline to serve anyone who cannot produce evidence of genuine ID. Display 'Challenge 21' posters.

 - Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display
 of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day,
 provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a
 contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts
 are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
 - Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
 - Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.

- o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking
 place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure
 that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been
 located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.

- 8. If you wish people to be able to consume alcohol on the premises, please tick 'on the premises'. If you wish people to be able to purchase alcohol to consume away from the premises, please tick 'off the premises'. If you wish people to be able to do both, please tick 'both'.
- 9. Please give information about anything intended to occur at the premises or ancillary to the use of the premises which may give rise to concern in respect of children, regardless of whether you intend children to have access to the premises, for example (but not exclusively) nudity or seminudity, films for restricted age groups or the presence of gaming machines.
- 10. Please list here steps you will take to promote all four licensing objectives together.
- 11. The application form must be signed.
- 12. An applicant's agent (for example solicitor) may sign the form on their behalf provided that they have actual authority to do so.
- 13. Where there is more than one applicant, each of the applicants or their respective agent must sign the application form.
- 14. This is the address which we shall use to correspond with you about this application.

15. Entitlement to work/immigration status for individual applicants and applications from partnerships which are not limited liability partnerships:

A licence may not be held by an individual or an individual in a partnership who is resident in the UK who:

- does not have the right to live and work in the UK; or
- is subject to a condition preventing him or her from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

Any premises licence issued in respect of an application made on or after 6 April 2017 will become invalid if the holder ceases to be entitled to work in the UK.

Applicants must demonstrate that they have an entitlement to work in the UK and are not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

They do this in one of two ways:

- 1) by providing with this application copies or scanned copies of the documents which an applicant has provided, to demonstrate their entitlement to work in the UK (which do not need to be certified) as per information published on gov.uk and in guidance.
- 2) by providing their 'share code' to enable the licensing authority to carry out a check using the Home Office online right to work checking service (see below).

Home Office online right to work checking service

As an alternative to providing a copy of original documents, sted above, applicants may demonstrate their right to work by allowing the licensing authority to carry out a check with the Home Office online right to work checking service.

To demonstrate their right to work via the Home Office online right to work checking service, applicants should include in this application their share code (provided to them upon accessing the service at https://www.gov.uk/prove-right-to-work) which, along with the applicant's date of birth, will allow the licensing authority to carry out the check.

In order to establish the applicant's right to work, the check will need to indicate that the applicant is allowed to work in the United Kingdom and is not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

An online check will not be possible in all circumstances because not all applicants will have an immigration status that can be shared digitally. The Home Office online right to work checking service sets out what information and/or documentation applicants will need in order to access the service. Applicants who are unable to obtain a chare code from the service should submit copy documents as set out above.

Your right to work will be checked as part of your licensing application and this could involve us checking your immigration status with the Home Office. We may otherwise share information with the Home Office. We may otherwise share information with the Home Office. Your licence application will not be determined until you have complied with this guidance.
