Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

MANDATORY CONDITIONS WHERE LICENCE AUTHORISES SUPPLY OF ALCOHOL

(1) In accordance with section 19 of the Licensing Act 2003, where a premises licence authorises the supply of alcohol, the licence must include the following conditions.

(2) The first condition is that no supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence -

(a) at a time where there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or

(b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

(3) The second condition is that every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Embedded Restrictions

STANDARD PRE-EXISTING CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO ON LICENCE WITH NO CHILDREN'S CERTIFICATE

Permitted Hours

1. Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours. In this condition permitted hours means:

- a) On weekdays (other than Christmas Day or Good Friday) 10:00 to 23:00
- b) On Sundays (other than Christmas Day) 12:00 to 22:30
- c) On Good Friday, 12:00 to 22:30
- d) On Christmas Day, 12:00 to 15:00 and 19:00 to 22:30
- e) On New Year's Eve from the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on the following day (or if there are no permitted hours on the following day, midnight on 31st December).

The above restrictions do not prohibit:

- a) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours the consumption of alcohol on the premises
- b) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking away of alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel
- c) during the first thirty minutes after the above hours, the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there if the alcohol was supplied for consumption as an ancillary to their meals.
- d) the sale or supply of alcohol to, or consumption of alcohol by, any person residing at the licensed premises
- e) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the dispatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered
- f) the sale or alcohol to a trader for the purpose of his trade, or to a registered club for the purposes of the club
- g) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces
- h) the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there
- i) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied
- j) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

Children

2. No person under fourteen shall be allowed in the bar of the licensed premises during the permitted hours unless one of the following applies:

- a) He is the child of the holder of the premises licence.
- b) He resides in the premises, but is not employed there.

- c) He is in the bar solely for the purpose of passing to or from some part of the premises which is not a bar and to or from which there is no other convenient means of access or egress.
- d) The bar is in railway refreshment rooms or other premises constructed, fitted and intended to be used bona fide for any purpose to which the holding of the licence is merely ancillary.

In this condition bar includes any place exclusively or mainly used for the sale and consumption of intoxicating liquor, but does not include a bar at any time when it is usual in the premises in question for it to be, and it is -

- i) set apart for the service of table meals, and
- ii) not used for the sale or supply of intoxicating liquor otherwise than to persons having table meals there and for consumption by such persons as an ancillary to his meal.

Credit Sales

3. Intoxicating liquor shall not be sold or supplied for consumption on the premises unless it is paid for before or at the time when it is sold or supplied. This condition, however, shall not apply:

- a) If the liquor is sold or supplied for consumption at a meal supplied at the same time, is consumed with the meal and is paid for together with the meal, or
- b) If the liquor is sold or supplied for consumption by a person residing in the premises or his guests and is paid for together with his accommodation, or
- c) If the sale or supply of intoxicating liquor is to any canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or to an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces.

Other Conditions

- 4. There shall be no public bar upon the premises with direct access off the street.
- 5. There shall be no off sales of liquor of any description except to residents.
- 6. The sale and supply of alcohol shall be limited to:

- a) Residents of the said premises;
- b) Persons taking table meals at the said premises whether they are residents or not;
- c) Persons attending the said premises for bona fide functions, organised meetings and party groups;
- d) Persons taking bar snacks or basket meals at the said premises.

ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS

Late Night Refreshment

The licence holder may also provide and permit the consumption of late night refreshment for a period of 30 minutes after the permitted hours set out below.

Private Entertainment

As the provisions of the Private Places of Entertainment (Licensing) Act 1967 was previously adopted and applied throughout the City of York Council area, private entertainment for gain may be provided throughout the premises without limitation by virtue of the previous Justices' Licence.

Recorded Music

Recorded music may be played throughout the premises without limitation in line with previous provisions as set out in Section 182 of the Licensing Act 1964.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

For Regulated Entertainment consisting of Music and Dancing

- a) The licence holder shall attach a copy of the City Council's Rules for the Management of Places of Public Entertainment to the valid licence. This document shall form part of the licence.
- b) The licence holder shall ensure prompt compliance with any written report received from the City Council.
- c) The licence holder shall ensure prompt compliance with any written report received from North Yorkshire Fire and Rescue Service.
- d) The maximum occupancy of the licensed premises shall not exceed the following numbers at any time:

Blenheim Room - 50 persons

NB: No part of the premises other than the area(s) specified above shall be used for purposes permitted by this licence.

- e) The permitted hours that the licensed premises may be open for the purposes of Regulated Entertainment are:

Monday-Sunday
20:00-01:00
