Section 18(3)(a) Application for a premise licence for Alcuin College-Alcuin Bistro, University of York, Heslington, York, YO10 5DD.

Summary

- 1. This report seeks Members determination of an application for the grant of a premise licence, which has been made under the Licensing Act 2003.

Background

- 7. The operating schedule submitted by the applicant shows that the licensing objectives would be met by complying with university policy documents. These policies are shown in Annex 2 and the Licensed Premises Drug Policy at Annex 3.

Special Policy Consideration

13. This premise is not located within the special policy area.

Consultation

- 14. Consultation was carried out by the applicant in accordance with s13, and s17 (5) of the Act and Regulation 42, Parts 2 and 4 of the Licensing Act 2003 (Premises Licences and Club Premises Certificates) Regulations 2005, which concern the displaying of a notice on the premises and an advertisement in a local paper giving details of the application and serving a copy of the application on all responsible authorities. The applicant complied with all statutory requirements. In addition the relevant ward councillors were notified by way of register.
- 15. All procedural aspects of this application have been complied with.

Summary of Representations made by Responsible Authorities

16. North Yorkshire Police have met with the applicants who agreed to a series of conditions being added to the licence if granted and as such there is no representation from the police. These conditions are listed at Annex 4.

Summary of Representations made by Parties other than Responsible Authorities

- 17. Relevant representations have been received from 9 people who live in the area. Their details are shown at Annex 5 and their representations at Annex 6.
- 18. A map showing the general area around the venue is attached at Annex 7.

Planning Issues

19. There are no planning issues.

Options

- 20. By virtue of s18 (4) of the Act, the Committee have the following options available to them in making their decision: -
- 21. <u>Option 1</u>: Grant the licence in the terms applied for.
- 22. <u>Option 2</u>: Grant the licence with modified/additional conditions imposed by the licensing committee.
- 23. <u>Option 3</u>: Grant the licence to exclude any of the licensable activities to which the application relates and modify/add conditions accordingly.
- 24. Option 4: Reject the application.

Analysis

- 25 The following could be the result of any decision made this Sub Committee:-
- 26. <u>Option 1</u>: This decision could be appealed at Magistrates Court by any of the representors.
- 27. <u>Option 2</u>: This decision could be appealed at Magistrates Court by the applicant or any of the representors.
- 28. <u>Option 3</u>: This decision could be appealed at Magistrates Court by the applicant or any of the representors.
- 29. <u>Option 4</u>: This decision could be appealed at Magistrates Court by the applicant.

- 30. The Licensing Act 2003 has 4 objectives the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety, prevention of public nuisance and the protection of children from harm.
