

Re. Rufforth Primary School/Community Hall Licence application for provision of regulated entertainment and facilities

Despite a history of strong local opposition by a significant number of residents to this venture, we accept that the Community Hall aspect of the school development has now become fact. However, we wish to record our concerns and remain apprehensive of the impact of noise disturbance from any future events, specifically 'live music', 'recorded music' and 'performance of dance' as regulated entertainment and the provision of entertainment facilities for 'making music' and 'dancing'.

We have not been reassured that sound insulation will adequately contain intrusive noise, and any material benefit of insulation will be lost when windows are opened in warmer months or during intense aerobic activity. Sports activity will generate the unnerving disturbance of percussion thumping from balls and raised voices, neither of which are appropriate for a residential area, and we are concerned that a rumoured desire to make this a revenue generating venture will be at the expense of a significant number of Rufforth residents' reasonable expectation of peaceful enjoyment of their own homes and gardens.
