## Comments received during Consultation for a Residents' Priority parking Scheme in Newborough Street

Comments by those opposed to the scheme.	Officer response
There is no mention of permits for mopeds	This is a valid comment and we will include the information for future consultations. Mopeds/motorcycles do not have to display a permit and can park for free.
I cannot afford a car or afford to purchase visitor permits for my partner who lives away and visits every other weekend. If my partner leaves his car for longer than a day when we are on holiday, what do we do? Leave 7 or 8 consecutive permits in the car? Cost of permit should be free; we should not have to pay for the right to park our cars. (3 residents)	There is no statutory right to park a vehicle on street. Prices are approved by members within the budget figures.
The introduction on our street will increase pressure on nearby streets. Problem not solved, just moved. (3 residents)	This is a valid point; a scheme over the wider area would be preferable to avoid this.
A prospective candidate raised the petition as a political manoeuvre.	
The street acts as an overflow for the nearby hospital which has insufficient staff parking. If it is outside my house while I am at work, I have no objection. (2 residents)	Other residents have different views and resent hospital staff parking
The current system may be a free for all – but it works so why change it. (2 residents)	

<p>We cannot park outside our house anyway because of double yellow lines.</p>	<p>Waiting restrictions are in place at junction areas and opposite the new development (Burton Green) for manoeuvrability and access. These are necessary to protect statutory highway rights (pass and repass).</p>
<p>I believe the police would not enforce any parking restriction during football matches which is one of the biggest problems. If this is true it should have been mentioned within the consultation documents.</p>	<p>The restrictions are enforced by our Civil Enforcement Team not North Yorkshire Police. Parking Services do undertake enforcement on match days.</p>
<p><b>Comments by those in favour of the scheme</b></p>	<p><b>Officer Response</b></p>
<p>The pollution caused by cars driving around looking for parking is a nightmare.</p>	
<p>The Hospital Staff use the street for free parking. Too many non resident cars Mon- Fri, it is unfair that I cannot park close to my property. (raised by 4 residents)</p>	<p>Hospital and other commuter parking is extensive in this area.</p>
<p>As most of the houses are private lets or student accommodation, I do not believe permit parking will be popular, but it will be wonderful. We should only consider the views of home owners and not students and tenants. (raised by 2 residents)</p>	<p>All residents' views should be considered.</p>
<p>Non residential drivers bump your car, chuck their litter, play loud music, sit outside with engines running.</p>	<p>Resident parking is not an access restriction. Vehicles can still enter the street and may sit with engines running for loading/unloading purposes.</p>
<p>Some cars go too fast</p>	<p>This is unlikely to change with resident parking,</p>

<p>(raised by 2 residents)</p>	<p>fewer parked cars may even increase vehicle speeds. Residents can request a speed review through the Safer York Partnership. Details and application form are available on the website.</p>
<p>Respark could reduce traffic noise in our street and increase safety for our pets and children.</p>	<p>Newborough Street is not a cul-de-sac and therefore traffic will continue to use the street as a through route whether or not Resident Parking is introduced.</p>
<p>Has Bootham Green been included in this vote as they have possibly added to more difficulties parking on Newborough Street.</p>	<p>Bootham Green (new development) are not included within the consultation and would not be included within the scheme if it were progressed.</p>
<p>My property is an HMO, please ensure any scheme includes parking permits for HMO tenants.</p>	<p>More than one property are HMO's on Newborough Street. They would be included within a scheme design.</p>
<p>Please ensure the space in front of my gate (vehicle access) is kept clear within any scheme designed.</p>	<p>There is an existing white keep clear bar marking at the entrance.</p>
